**ORDER OF THE MISSOURI STATE BOARD OF COSMETOLOGY  
AND BARBER EXAMINERS ISSUING A PROBATIONARY  
COSMETOLOGY STUDENT LICENSE TO SHANNON EVANS**

The Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners (the "Board") hereby issues its ORDER granting a PROBATIONARY COSMETOLOGY STUDENT LICENSE, License No. (2011015047) to Shannon Evans, pursuant to the provisions of § 324.038, RSMo. As set forth in § 324.038.2, RSMo, Evans may submit a written request to the Administrative Hearing Commission seeking a hearing and review of the Board's decision to issue a probated student license. Such written request must be filed with the Administrative Hearing Commission within 30 days of delivery or mailing of this Order of the Board. The written request should be addressed to the Administrative Hearing Commission, P.O. Box 1557, Truman State Office Building, Room 640, Jefferson City, MO 65102-1557. If no written request for review is filed with the Administrative Hearing Commission within the 30-day period, the right to seek review of the Board's decision shall be considered waived. Should Evans file a written request for review of this Order, the terms and conditions of this Order shall remain in force and effect unless and/or until such time as the Administrative Hearing Commission issues an Order to the contrary.

Based upon the foregoing, the Board hereby states:

I.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board is an agency of the state of Missouri created and established pursuant to § 329.015, RSMo Cum. Supp. 2009, for the purpose of licensing all persons engaged in the practice of barbering and cosmetology in this state. The Board has control and supervision of the licensed occupations and enforcement of the terms and provisions of Chapters 328 and 329, RSMo (as amended).

2. On or about May 4, 1999 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 14R05990089, to the class B misdemeanor of Property Damage-2<sup>nd</sup> degree, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of 15 days in jail. Evans received a Suspended Execution of Sentence and was placed on probation for a period of one year under the supervision of the Missouri Board of Probation and Parole.

3. On or about May 4, 1999 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 14R05990089, to the class A misdemeanor of Assault-3<sup>rd</sup> degree, for which Evans was sentenced to one year in jail. Evans received a Suspended Execution of Sentence and was placed on probation for a period of two years under the supervision of the Missouri Board of Probation and Parole.

4. On or about April 3, 2000 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 14R059900989, to the class A misdemeanor of Operating Motor Vehicle without a License, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of 10 days in jail.

5. On or about January 14, 2002 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 01CR176043, to the class A misdemeanor of Driving while Intoxicated-prior offender. for which Evans was sentenced to a period of 30 days in jail.

6. On or about April 9, 2002 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 02CR176346, to the class A misdemeanor of Assault-3<sup>rd</sup> degree, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of 30 days in jail.

7. On or about April 12, 2002 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 01CR176233-02, to the class D felony of Unlawful Use Of A Weapon, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of five years in Missouri Department of Corrections. Evans received 91 days of Shock Incarceration.

8. On or about April 12, 2002 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 01CR176233-02, to the class C felony of two counts of Possession Of Controlled Substance Except 35 Grams Or Less Of Marijuana, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of five years in Missouri Department of Corrections. Evans received 91 days of Shock Incarceration.

9. On or about April 12, 2002 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 02CR176350-02, to the class B felony of Burglary – 1<sup>st</sup> Degree, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of five years in Missouri Department of Corrections. Evans received 91 days of Shock Incarceration.

10. On or about April 12, 2002 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 02CR176350-02, to the class C felony of Assault – 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of five years in Missouri Department of Corrections. Evans received 91 days of Shock Incarceration.

11. On or about April 12, 2002 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 02CR176350-02, to the class D felony of Unlawful Use

Of A Weapon, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of five years in Missouri Department of Corrections. Evans received 91 days of Shock Incarceration.

12. On or about July 9, 2002 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 02CR176764-01, to the class D felony of Leaving the Scene of Motor Vehicle Accident, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of three years in Missouri Department of Corrections.

13. On or about July 9, 2002 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 02CR176764-01, to the class D felony of DWI-persistent offender, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of three years in Missouri Department of Corrections.

14. On or about July 9, 2002 Evans pled guilty in the Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 02CR176764-01, to the class A misdemeanor of Operating Motor Vehicle while License Revoked, for which Evans was sentenced to a period of 30 days in jail. Evans received a Suspended Execution of Sentence and was placed on one year probation. Probation was tolled until after release from Missouri Department of Corrections.

15. On or about February 22, 2006 Evans pled guilty in Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 05RA-CR00783-01, to a class C felony of Possession of Controlled Substance Except 35 grams or less of Marijuana, for which Evans was sentenced to five years in Missouri Department of Corrections.

16. On or about February 22, 2006 Evans pled guilty in Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 05RA-CR00783-01, to a class C felony of Forgery, for which Evans was sentenced to two years in Missouri Department of Corrections.

17. On or about February 22, 2006 Evans pled guilty in Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 05RA-CR00783-01, to a class C felony of Keeping or Maintaining a Public Nuisance, for which Evans was sentenced to two years in Missouri Department of Corrections.

18. On or about August 6, 2009 Evans pled guilty in Boone County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 07BA-CR004598, to a class A misdemeanor of Leaving the Scene of a Motor Vehicle Accident, for which Evans was sentenced to one year in jail. Evans received a Suspended Execution of Sentence and was placed on unsupervised probation for a period of two years.

19. On or about October 8, 2008 Evans pled guilty in Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 08RA-CR00413-01(Count I), to a class D felony of DWI combined alcohol/drug Intoxication-persistent offender, for which Evans was sentenced to two years in Missouri Department of Corrections.

20. On or about October 8, 2008 Evans pled guilty in Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 08RA-CR00413-01(Count II), to a class C felony of Possession of Controlled Substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana, for which Evans was sentenced to five years in Missouri Department of Corrections.

21. On or about October 8, 2008 Evans pled guilty in Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 08RA-CR00413-01(Count III), to a class C felony of Possession of a Controlled Substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana, for which Evans was sentenced to five years in Missouri Department of Corrections.

22. On or about October 20, 2008 Evans pled guilty in Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 08RA-CR00516-01, to a class C felony of Possession of

Controlled Substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana, for which Evans was sentenced to five years in Missouri Department of Corrections.

23. On or about December 8, 2008 Evans pled guilty in Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 08RA-CR00878-01, to a class C felony of Tampering with a Motor Vehicle, for which Evans was sentenced to three years in Missouri Department of Corrections. Evans received a Suspended Execution of Sentence and was placed on probation for a period of five years supervised by the Missouri Board of Probation and Parole.

24. On or about August, 24, 2010 Evans pled guilty in Randolph County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 10RA-CR00299, to a class A misdemeanor of Operating a Motor Vehicle on a Highway without a Valid license, for which Evans was sentenced to 90 days in jail.

25. On or about November 23, 2010 Evans pled guilty in Boone County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 10BA-CR01061, to a class A misdemeanor of Leaving the Scene of a Motor Vehicle Accident, for which Evans was sentenced to six months in jail.

26. On or about November 23, 2010 Evans pled guilty in Boone County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 10BA-CR01387, to a class A misdemeanor of Theft/Stealing, for which Evans was sentenced to six months in jail.

27. On or about November 23, 2010 Evans pled guilty in Boone County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 10BA-CR01688, to a class B misdemeanor of Peace Disturbance-First Offence, for which Evans was sentenced to 120 days in jail.

28. On or about November 23, 2010 Evans pled guilty in Boone County Circuit Court, State of Missouri, case number 10BA-CR02035, to a class A misdemeanor of

Theft/Stealing (Value of Property or Services less than \$500), for which Evans was sentenced to six months in jail.

29. On or about February 28, 2011 Shannon Evans applied for a Missouri cosmetology student license.

## II.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

30. The Board has authority to deny or refuse a license application pursuant to § 329.140.1, RSMo 2000, which provides:

The board may refuse to issue any certificate of registration or authority, permit or license required pursuant to this chapter for one or any combination of causes stated in subsection 2 of this section. The board shall notify the applicant in writing of the reasons for the refusal and shall advise the applicant of his right to file a complaint with the administrative hearing commission as provided by chapter 621, RSMo.

31. The Board has cause to deny or refuse Smith's application for a cosmetology student license pursuant to § 329.140.2, RSMo, which provides:

The board may cause a complaint to be filed with the administrative hearing commission as provided by chapter 621, RSMo, against any holder of any certificate of registration or authority, permit or license required by this chapter or any person who has failed to renew or has surrendered the person's certificate of registration or authority, permit or license for any one or any combination of the following causes:

...

(2) The person has been finally adjudicated and found guilty, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, in a criminal prosecution under the laws of any state or of the United States, for any offense reasonably related to the qualifications, functions or duties of any profession licensed or regulated under this chapter, for any offense an essential element of which is fraud, dishonesty or an act of violence, or for any offense involving moral turpitude, whether or not sentence is imposed[.]

32. As a result of Evans' actions as set forth in paragraphs 2 through 4 above, the Board has cause to deny or refuse Evans' application for a cosmetology student license pursuant to § 329.140.1, RSMo, and § 329.140.2(2), RSMo.

33. As an alternative to refusing to issue a license, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a license subject to probation, pursuant to § 324.038, RSMo, which provides:

Whenever a board within or assigned to the division of professional registration, including the division itself when so empowered, may refuse to issue a license for reasons which also serve as a basis for filing a complaint with the administrative hearing commission seeking disciplinary action against a holder of a license, the board, as an alternative to refusing to issue a license, may, at its discretion, issue to an applicant a license subject to probation.

34. The Board issues this Order in lieu of denial of Evans' application for a cosmetology student license. The Board has determined that this Order is necessary to ensure the protection of the public.

### III.

#### ORDER

Based on the foregoing, Shannon Evans is granted a cosmetology student license, which is hereby placed on **PROBATION** for the period during which she is enrolled in cosmetology school and receiving training hours, not to exceed five (5) years from the effective date of this Order. During the aforementioned probation, Shannon Evans shall be entitled to enroll as a cosmetology student subject to the following terms and conditions.

### IV.

#### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

During the aforementioned probation, Shannon Evans, Applicant, shall be entitled to enroll as a cosmetology student subject to the following terms and conditions:

- A. During the disciplinary period, Applicant shall comply with all provisions of Chapter 329, RSMo, all applicable board regulations, all applicable federal and state drug laws, rules and regulations and all applicable federal and state criminal laws. "State" includes the state of Missouri, all other states and territories of the United States, and the ordinances of their political subdivisions.
- B. During the disciplinary period, Applicant shall keep the Board informed of Applicant's current work and home telephone numbers. Applicant shall notify the Board in writing within ten days (10) of any change in this information.
- C. During the probationary period, Applicant shall timely renew Applicant's student license granted hereby and shall timely pay all fees required for licensure and comply with all other Board requirements necessary to maintain said license in a current and active state.
- D. During the probationary period, Applicant shall accept and comply with unannounced visits from the Board's representatives to monitor compliance with the terms and conditions of this Order.
- E. During the disciplinary period, Applicant shall appear in person for interviews with the Board or its designee upon request.
- F. Applicant shall submit written reports to the Board on or before January 1 and July 1 during each year of the probationary period stating truthfully whether there has been compliance with all terms and conditions of this Order. The first such report shall be received by the Board on or before July 1, 2011.
- G. If, at any time during the probationary period, Applicant changes Applicant's address from the state of Missouri, or ceases to maintain Applicant's cosmetology student license current or active under the provisions of Chapter 329, RSMo, or fails to keep the Board advised of all current places of residence, the time of such absence, unlicensed or inactive status, or unknown whereabouts shall not be deemed or taken to satisfy any part of the probationary period.
- H. The Board retains jurisdiction to hold a hearing at any time to determine if a violation of this Order has occurred and, if a violation of this Order has occurred, may seek to amend this Order or impose further disciplinary or appropriate action at the discretion of the Board. No order shall be entered by the Board pursuant to this paragraph without any required notice and opportunity for a hearing before the Board as provided by Chapter 536, RSMo.
- I. Unless otherwise specified by the Board, all reports, documentation, notices, or other materials required to be submitted to the Board shall be forwarded to: Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners, P.O. Box 1335, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.

J. Any failure by Applicant to comply with any condition of discipline set forth herein constitutes a violation of this Order.

This Order does not bind the Board or restrict the remedies available to it concerning any violation by Applicant of the terms and conditions of this Order, Chapter 329, RSMo, or the regulations promulgated thereunder.

The Board will maintain this Order as an open, public record of the Board as provided in Chapters 329, 610, and 324, RSMo.
