**ORDER OF THE MISSOURI STATE BOARD OF COSMETOLOGY  
AND BARBER EXAMINERS ISSUING A PROBATIONARY  
COSMETOLOGY STUDENT LICENSE TO CRYSTAL LYNN HUNT**

The Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners (the "Board") hereby issues its **ORDER** granting a **PROBATIONARY COSMETOLOGY STUDENT LICENSE**, License No. 2014001260 to Crystal Lynn Hunt ("Hunt" or "Applicant"), pursuant to the provisions of § 324.038, RSMo.<sup>1</sup> As set forth in § 324.038.2, RSMo, Hunt may submit a written request to the Administrative Hearing Commission seeking a hearing and review of the Board's decision to issue a probated student license. Such written request must be filed with the Administrative Hearing Commission within 30 days of delivery or mailing of this Order of the Board. The written request should be addressed to the Administrative Hearing Commission, P.O. Box 1557, Truman State Office Building, Room 640, Jefferson City, MO 65102-1557. If no written request for review is filed with the Administrative Hearing Commission within the 30-day period, the right to seek review of the Board's decision shall be considered waived. Should Hunt file a written request for review of this Order, the terms and conditions of this Order shall remain in force and effect unless and/or until such time as the Administrative Hearing Commission issues an Order to the contrary.

Based upon the foregoing, the Board hereby states:

I.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board is an agency of the state of Missouri created and established pursuant to § 329.015, RSMo, for the purpose of licensing all persons engaged in the practice of barbering and cosmetology in this state. The Board has control and supervision of the licensed occupations and enforcement of the terms and provisions of Chapters 328 and 329, RSMo.

2. On or about July 24, 2015, Hunt applied for a Missouri cosmetology student license to enroll at Sam Brown's Cosmetology & Barber Institute, 1729 W. Broadway, Columbia, Missouri.

3. On her application, Hunt answered "yes" to the question "Have you been adjudicated and found guilty, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, in a criminal prosecution in this state, or any or of the United States, whether or not sentence was imposed?"

4. In conjunction with her July 24, 2015 application, Hunt provided an explanation of her criminal history. In her explanation, Hunt listed her misdemeanor charges and explanations for each. Hunt stated that in October of 2005 she was charged with DWI/Alcohol and failure to signal. In November of 2005, Hunt stated that she was charged Peace Disturbance and 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Trespassing resulting from a disagreement with her boyfriend. In July of 2007, Hunt noted that she was charged, twice, with Driving While Revoked after being pulled over for a routine traffic stop. In January of 2009, July of 2009 and June of 2011, Hunt noted she was charged with Stealing Less Than \$500 for the January and July incidents and Charged with Stealing 3<sup>rd</sup> offense for the June 2011 incident. Hunt listed her felony charges as including August 2006 class B felonies for Distribution of a Controlled Substance, resulting from her

selling a controlled substance “to the same undercover officer twice;” and the April 2013 class D felony of Stealing – 3<sup>rd</sup> offense.

5. A review of Hunt’s Missouri criminal history reveals:

a. On or about April 4, 2006, Hunt pled guilty to the class B misdemeanor of *Dwi – Alcohol* and the class C misdemeanor of *Fail To Signal/Give Improper Signal When Stopping/Turning Left Or Right*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 05BA-CR04964. The Court sentenced Hunt to 30 days’ jail incarceration on the Dwi charge, but suspended execution of the sentence and placed Hunt on two years’ unsupervised probation. Hunt was fined for the class C misdemeanor;

b. On or about April 4, 2006, Hunt pled guilty to the class B misdemeanor of *Peace Disturbance – First Offense* and the class B misdemeanor of *Trespass – 1<sup>st</sup> Degree*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 05BA-CR05460. The Court sentenced Hunt to 90 days’ jail incarceration on both misdemeanors but suspended execution of the sentence on both and placed Hunt on two years’ unsupervised probation;

c. On or about November 20, 2006, Hunt pled guilty to the class B felony charges (2) of *Dist/Del/Manf/Produce Or Attempt To Or Possess W/Intent To Dist/Del/Manf/Produce A Controlled Substance*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 06BA-CR04103. The Court sentenced Hunt to seven years’ incarceration, suspended execution of the sentence and placed Hunt on five years’ supervised probation. On January 11, 2010, Hunt’s probation was revoked and her sentence ordered executed. On May 11, 2010, Hunt was granted release and again placed on five years’ supervised probation with conditions. On April 29, 2013, Hunt’s probation was again revoked and the seven year sentence was ordered executed;

d. On or about July 19, 2007, Hunt pled guilty to the unclassified misdemeanor of *Minor Visibly Intoxicated/Blood Alcohol Content More Than .02% - 1<sup>st</sup> Offense*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 07BA-CR02711. The Court fined Hunt and placed her on two years' unsupervised probation;

e. On or about February 15, 2008, Hunt pled guilty to the class A misdemeanor of *Oper Mtr Veh On Hwy While Driver License/Privilege Revkd (Revkd For Points/Fail To Submit To Chem Test)* and the unclassified misdemeanor of *Displayed Unlawful Plate/Placard On Mtr Veh/Tri*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 07BA-CR03380. The Court sentenced Hunt to two days incarceration in the Boone County Jail on each charge to run concurrently;

f. On or about February 15, 2008, Hunt pled guilty to the class A misdemeanor of *Oper Mtr Veh On Hwy While Driver License/Privilege Revkd (Revkd For Points/Fail To Submit To Chem Test)*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 07BA-CR03605. The Court sentenced Hunt to three days incarceration in the Boone County Jail to run concurrently with case number 07BA-CR03380;

g. On or about April 23, 2009, Hunt pled guilty to the class A misdemeanor of *Theft/Stealing (Value Of Property Or Services Is Less Than \$500)*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 09BA-CR00728. The Court sentenced Hunt to 120 days incarceration in the Boone County Jail, suspended execution of sentence and placed Hunt on two years' unsupervised probation with conditions as stated in the docket entry. On February 4, 2010, the Court revoked Hunt's probation and ordered the sentence to be executed;

g. On or about February 4, 2010, Hunt pled guilty to the class A misdemeanor of *Theft/Stealing (Value Of Property Or Services Is Less Than \$500)*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 09BA-CR04179. The Court sentenced Hunt to 120 days incarceration in the Boone County Jail to run concurrently with her Department of Correction time;

h. On or about June 25, 2012, Hunt pled guilty to the class A misdemeanor of *Theft/Stealing (Value Of Property Or Services Is Less Than \$500)*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 11BA-CR02555-01. The Court sentenced Hunt to 120 days incarceration in the Boone County Jail to start on June 27, 2012 at 4:00 p.m.;

i. On or about June 26, 2012, Hunt pled guilty to the class A misdemeanor of *Theft/Stealing (Value Of Property Or Services Is Less Than \$500)*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 12BA-CR01173. The Court sentenced Hunt to 120 days incarceration in the Boone County Jail;

j. On or about June 26, 2012, Hunt pled guilty to the class A misdemeanor of *Theft/Stealing (Value Of Property Or Services Is Less Than \$500)*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 12BA-CR01543. The Court sentenced Hunt to 120 days incarceration in the Boone County Jail;

k. On or about April 29, 2013, Hunt pled guilty to the class D felony of *Stealing Related Ofns – 3<sup>rd</sup> Ofns (Stealing, Buying, Receiving, Robbery)*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri case number 13BA-CR00196-01. The Court sentenced Hunt to 3 years' incarceration in the Missouri Department of Corrections.

II.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

6. The Board has authority to deny or refuse a license application pursuant to § 329.140.1, RSMo, which provides:

The board may refuse to issue any certificate of registration or authority, permit or license required pursuant to this chapter for one or any combination of causes stated in subsection 2 of this section. The board shall notify the applicant in writing of the reasons for the refusal and shall advise the applicant of his right to file a complaint with the administrative hearing commission as provided by chapter 621, RSMo.

7. The Board has cause to deny or refuse Hunt's application for a cosmetology student license pursuant to § 329.140.2, RSMo, which provides:

~~The board may cause a complaint to be filed with the administrative hearing commission as provided by chapter 621, RSMo, against any holder of any certificate of registration or authority, permit or license required by this chapter or any person who has failed to renew or has surrendered the person's certificate of registration or authority, permit or license for any one or any combination of the following causes:~~

...

(2) The person has been finally adjudicated and found guilty, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, in a criminal prosecution under the laws of any state or of the United States, for any offense reasonably related to the qualifications, functions or duties of any profession licensed or regulated under this chapter, for any offense an essential element of which is fraud, dishonesty or an act of violence, or for any offense involving moral turpitude, whether or not sentence is imposed[.]

8. As a result of Hunt's guilty pleas as detailed in paragraph 5 above, the Board has cause to deny or refuse Hunt's application for a cosmetology student license pursuant to § 329.140.1, RSMo, and § 329.140.2(2), RSMo.

9. As an alternative to refusing to issue a license, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a license subject to probation, pursuant to § 324.038, RSMo, which provides:

Whenever a board within or assigned to the division of professional registration, including the division itself when so empowered, may refuse to issue a license for reasons which also serve as a basis for filing a complaint with the administrative hearing commission seeking disciplinary action against a holder of a license, the board, as an alternative to refusing to issue a license, may, at its discretion, issue to an applicant a license subject to probation.

10. The Board issues this Order in lieu of denial of Hunt's application for a cosmetology student license. The Board has determined that this Order is necessary to ensure the protection of the public.

### III.

#### ORDER

11. Based on the foregoing, Crystal Lynn Hunt is granted a cosmetology **student license**, which is hereby placed on **PROBATION** for the period during which she is enrolled in cosmetology school and receiving training hours, not to exceed five (5) years from the effective date of this Order. During the aforementioned probation, Crystal Lynn Hunt shall be entitled to enroll as a cosmetology student subject to the following terms and conditions.

### IV.

#### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

12. During the aforementioned probation, Crystal Lynn Hunt, shall be entitled to enroll as a cosmetology student subject to the following terms and conditions:

- A. During the disciplinary period, Applicant shall comply with all provisions of Chapter 329, RSMo, all applicable board regulations, all applicable federal and state drug laws, rules and regulations and all applicable federal and state criminal laws. "State" includes the state of Missouri, all other states and territories of the United States, and the ordinances of their political subdivisions.
- B. During the disciplinary period, Applicant shall keep the Board informed of Applicant's current work and home telephone numbers. Applicant shall notify the Board in writing within ten days (10) of any change in this information.

- C. During the probationary period, Applicant shall accept and comply with unannounced visits from the Board's representatives to monitor compliance with the terms and conditions of this Order.
- D. During the disciplinary period, Applicant shall appear in person for interviews with the Board or its designee upon request.
- E. Applicant shall submit written reports to the Board on or before January 1 and July 1 during each year of the probationary period stating truthfully whether there has been compliance with all terms and conditions of this Order. The first such report shall be received by the Board on or before January 1, 2016.
- F. If, at any time during the probationary period, Applicant changes Applicant's address from the state of Missouri, or ceases to maintain Applicant's student license current or active under the provisions of Chapter 329, RSMo, or fails to keep the Board advised of all current places of residence, the time of such absence, unlicensed or inactive status, or unknown whereabouts shall not be deemed or taken to satisfy any part of the probationary period.
- G. The Board retains jurisdiction to hold a hearing at any time to determine if a violation of this Order has occurred and, if a violation of this Order has occurred, may seek to amend this Order or impose further disciplinary or appropriate action at the discretion of the Board. No order shall be entered by the Board pursuant to this paragraph without any required notice and opportunity for a hearing before the Board as provided by Chapter 536, RSMo.
- H. Unless otherwise specified by the Board, all reports, documentation, notices, or other materials required to be submitted to the Board shall be forwarded to: Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners, P.O. Box 1062, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- I. Any failure by Applicant to comply with any condition of discipline set forth herein constitutes a violation of this Order.

13. This Order does not bind the Board or restrict the remedies available to it concerning any violation by Applicant of the terms and conditions of this Order, Chapter 329, RSMo, or the regulations promulgated thereunder.

14. The Board will maintain this Order as an open, public record of the Board as provided in Chapters 329, 610 and 324, RSMo.
