**FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS  
OF LAW, AND DISCIPLINARY ORDER**

At its regularly scheduled meeting on May 16, 2016, at approximately 9:00 a.m., and pursuant to notice described in the Findings of Fact, the Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners ("Board") took up the probation violation complaint alleging that Steven Moriarty ("Respondent"), has failed to comply with the terms of his probation of his barber license, license number 010427.

The board appeared at the hearing through its attorney Jamie Cox. Despite adequate notice, Respondent did not appear at the hearing in person and was not represented by legal counsel. Division of Professional Registration Legal Counsel Sarah Ledgerwood served as the board's legal advisor at the hearing, during deliberations, and in the preparation of this order.

**Findings of Fact**

1. The Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners ("Board") is an agency of the State of Missouri created and existing pursuant to § 329.015, RSMo, for the purpose of executing and enforcing the provisions of Chapters 328 and 329, RSMo.
2. Respondent is a natural person whose home address of record with the Board is 440 West Front Street, Moscow Mills, Missouri 63362.
3. Respondent holds a barber operator license, license number 010427.
4. Respondent's barber operator license, license number 010427 was not at all relevant times, current and valid. Respondent's barber operator license had expired but was reinstated on March 2, 2016.

5. Respondent owns and operates a barber shop establishment, located at 604 W. Pearce Blvd., Wentzville, Missouri 63385.

6. On or about August 20, 2015, the Board issued its Finding of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Disciplinary Order ("Order"), which placed Respondent's barber operator license on probation for three years for the licensure violation of offering services to patrons for compensation at an establishment known as S & K Barber Shop without an establishment license. The Order was effective August 20, 2015.

7. Pursuant to Terms and Conditions Section IV, Specific Requirement, Paragraph I., of the August 20, 2015 Order, Respondent was required to obtain his barber establishment license within thirty days of the date of execution of the August 20, 2015 Order.

8. On or about September 10, 2015, the Board's inspector conducted an inspection of the establishment located at 604 W. Pearce Blvd., Wentzville, Missouri 63385. Respondent was present during the inspection, and Respondent's barber operator license was current, active and posted in public view.

9. The Board's September 10, 2015 inspection revealed that Respondent was providing and/or offering to provide barber services at the establishment without an establishment license in violation of section 328.115, RSMo, and 20 CSR 2085-10.010.

10. On or about September 23, 2015, the Board sent a violation notice regarding the September 10, 2015 inspection.

11. On or about November 5, 2015, the Board's inspector conducted an inspection at the establishment located at 604 W. Pearce Blvd., Wentzville, Missouri 63385. Respondent was present during the inspection, and Respondent's operator license was not current, active and posted in public view.

12. The Board's November 5, 2015 inspection revealed that Respondent was providing and/or offering to provide barber services at the establishment without an establishment license in violation of section 328.115, RSMo, and 20 CSR 2085-10.010; and Respondent's operator licenses had expired on September 30, 2015 and no current, active operator license was posted in public view in violation of 20 CSR 2085-10.010 and 20 CSR 2085-5.040(2)(C).

13. On or about November 17, 2015, the Board sent a violation notice regarding the November 5, 2015 inspection.

14. Respondent was subsequently issued a barber establishment license on February 10, 2016, and Respondent reinstated his barber operator license on March 2, 2016.

15. Pursuant to Terms and Conditions Section IV, General Requirements, Paragraph II. A., of the August 20, 2015 Order, Respondent, "[d]uring the probationary period" was to "... comply with all provisions of Chapters 328 and 329, RSMo, all applicable board regulations, all applicable federal and state drug laws, rules and regulations and all applicable federal and state criminal laws. "State" includes the state of Missouri, all other states and territories of the United States, and the ordinances of their political subdivisions."

16. Respondent failed to obtain an establishment license within thirty days of the date of execution of the August 20, 2015 Order and continued to violate section 328.115.1, RSMo, and 20 CSR 2085-10.010 and; Respondent failed to timely renew his barber operator license in violation of 20 CSR 2085-10.010 and 20 CSR 2085-5.040(2)(C).

17. Terms and Conditions Section IV, General Requirements, Paragraph II. I., of the August 20, 2015 Order states, "[t]he Board retains jurisdiction to hold a hearing at any time to determine if a violation of this Order has occurred and, if a violation of this Order has occurred, may seek to amend this Order or impose further disciplinary or appropriate action at the discretion of the Board. No order shall be entered by the Board pursuant to this paragraph without any required notice and opportunity for a hearing before the Board as provided by Chapter 536, RSMo."

#### **Conclusions of Law**

18. The Board has jurisdiction in this proceeding, pursuant to the August 20, 2015 Order and § 324.042 RSMo, to determine whether Respondent has violated the terms and conditions of the August 20, 2015 Order regarding Respondent's barber operator license, license number 010427, as described in the Findings of Fact of this Order.

19. Section 324.042, RSMo, provides:

Any board, commission, or committee within the division of professional registration may impose additional discipline when it finds after hearing

that a licensee, registrant, or permittee has violated any disciplinary terms previously imposed or agreed to pursuant to settlement. The board, commission, or committee may impose as additional discipline, any discipline it would be authorized to impose in an initial disciplinary hearing.

20. The August 20, 2015 Order and § 324.042, RSMo, allow the Board to take such disciplinary action that the Board deems appropriate for failure to comply with the terms and conditions of August 20, 2015 Order.

**Decision and Order**

21. It is the decision of the Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners that Respondent has violated the terms of the August 20, 2015 Order, and that his barber license, license number 010427 is, therefore, subject to further disciplinary action.

22. The Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners orders that Respondent's barber operator license, license number 010427, which is currently on probation until August 20, 2018, be assessed an additional one (1) year of **PROBATION**, until August 20, 2019, and continue to be subject to the terms and conditions of the August 20, 2015 Order.

23. The Board will maintain this Order as an open and public record of the Board as provided in Chapters 328, 329, 610, and 324, RSMo.

**FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS  
OF LAW, AND DISCIPLINARY ORDER**

On or about January 5, 2015, the Administrative Hearing Commission entered its Default Decision in the case of *Missouri Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners v. Steven Moriarty*, Case No. 14-1801 CB. In that Default Decision, the Administrative Hearing Commission found that Respondent Steven Moriarty's barber license (license # 010427) is subject to disciplinary action by the Missouri Board Cosmetology and Barber Examiners ("Board") pursuant to § 328.150.2(5), (6), (12) and (13), RSMo.<sup>1</sup>

The Board has received and reviewed the record of the proceedings before the Administrative Hearing Commission, including the properly pled complaint filed before the Administrative Hearing Commission on November 17, 2014 and the Default Decision of the Administrative Hearing Commission. The record of the Administrative Hearing Commission, including the properly pled complaint and Default Decision, is incorporated herein by reference in its entirety.

Pursuant to notice and § 621.110 and § 328.150, RSMo, the Board scheduled a hearing to be held on July 20, 2015, at approximately 9:00 a.m. at the Main Conference Meeting Room at the Division of Professional Registration Building, 3605 Missouri Boulevard, Jefferson City, Missouri

65109, for the purpose of determining the appropriate disciplinary action against Respondent's license. At the July 20, 2015 disciplinary hearing, the Board was represented by attorney Jamie Cox. Despite proper and timely notice, Respondent was not present for the hearing and was not represented by counsel. After being present and considering all of the evidence presented during the hearing, the Board issues the following Findings of Facts, Conclusions of Law and Order

Based upon the foregoing the Board hereby states:

I.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board is an agency of the state of Missouri created and established pursuant to § 329.015, RSMo and § 328.015, RSMo, for the purpose of licensing all persons engaged in the practice of barbering and cosmetology in this state. The Board has control and supervision of the licensed occupations and enforcement of the terms and provisions of Chapters 328 and 329, RSMo.
2. Respondent holds a barber license (license # 010427). Respondent's license was at all times, relevant to the Complaint filed, and is now, current and active.
3. The Board hereby adopts and incorporates by reference the properly pled complaint and Default Decision of the Administrative Hearing Commission in *Missouri Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners v. Steven Moriarty*, Case No. 14-1801 CB, in its entirety. In that Default Decision the Administrative Hearing Commission determined that the Board filed a properly pled complaint before the Administrative Hearing Commission on or about November 17, 2014, that Respondent was served with the complaint by certified mail and that Respondent never filed an answer or otherwise responded to the complaint.
4. In its Default Decision, the Administrative Hearing Commission determined there was cause to discipline Respondent's licenses pursuant to § 328.150.2(5), (6), (12) and (13), RSMo, as established in the properly pled complaint, as a result of Respondent's offering services to

patrons for compensation at an establishment known as S & K Barber Shop without an establishment license.

5. The Board set this matter for disciplinary hearing and served notice of the disciplinary hearing upon Respondent in a proper and timely fashion.

## II.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

6. This Board has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to §§ 621.110 and 328.150.3, RSMo.

7. The Board expressly adopts and incorporates by reference the properly pled complaint and the Default Decision issued by the Administrative Hearing Commission on January 5, 2015, in *Missouri Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners v. Steven Moriarty*, Case No. 14-1801 CB, and hereby enters its Conclusions of Law consistent therewith.

8. As a result of the foregoing, and in accordance with the Administrative Hearing Commission's Default Decision on January 5, 2015, Respondent's barber license (license # 010427) is subject to disciplinary action by the Board pursuant to § 328.150.2(5), (6), (12) and (13), RSMo.

9. The Board has determined that this Order is necessary to ensure the protection of the public.

## III.

### ORDER

Having fully considered all the evidence before the Board, and giving full weight to the Default Decision of the Administrative Hearing Commission, it is the ORDER of the Board that Respondent's barber license (license # 010427) shall immediately be placed on PROBATION for a period of three (3) years ("probationary period"), subject to the following terms and conditions.

## IV.

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

During the aforementioned probation, Steven Moriarty shall be entitled to perform barbering services as a licensed barber subject to the following terms and conditions:

### I. SPECIFIC REQUIREMENT

Respondent shall obtain his establishment license within 30 days of the date of execution of this Agreement.

### II. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- A. During the probationary period Respondent shall comply with all provisions of Chapters 328 and 329, RSMo, all applicable board regulations, all applicable federal and state drug laws, rules and regulations and all applicable federal and state criminal laws. "State" includes the state of Missouri, all other states and territories of the United States, and the ordinances of their political subdivisions.
- B. During the probationary period, Respondent shall keep the Board informed of Respondent's current telephone number and address. Respondent shall notify the Board in writing within ten days (10) of any change in this information.
- C. During the probationary period, Respondent shall timely renew Respondent's license and shall timely pay all fees required for licensure and comply with all other Board requirements necessary to maintain said licenses in a current and active state.
- D. During the probationary period, Respondent shall accept and comply with unannounced visits from the Board's representatives to monitor compliance with the terms and conditions of this Order.
- E. During the probationary period, Respondent shall appear in person for interviews with the Board or its designee upon request.
- F. During the probationary period, Respondent shall submit written reports to the Board on or before January 1 and July 1 during each year of the probationary period stating truthfully whether there has been compliance with all terms and conditions of this Order. The first such report shall be received by the Board on or before January 1, 2016.
- G. If, at any time during the probationary period, Respondent changes Respondent's address from the state of Missouri, or ceases to maintain Respondent's license as current or active under the provisions of Chapters 328 and 329, RSMo, or fails to keep the Board advised of all current places of residence, the time of such absence, unlicensed or inactive status, or unknown whereabouts shall not be deemed or taken to satisfy any part of the probationary period.
- H. Upon expiration of the probationary period, Respondent's license shall be fully restored if all requirements of the law have been satisfied; provided, however, that in the event the Board determines that Licensee has violated any term or condition of this Order, the Board


may, in its discretion, pursue any lawful remedies or procedures afforded it and is not bound by this Order in its determination of appropriate legal actions or remedies concerning the allegations identified herein.

- I. The Board retains jurisdiction to hold a hearing at any time to determine if a violation of this Order has occurred and, if a violation of this Order has occurred, may seek to amend this Order or impose further disciplinary or appropriate action at the discretion of the Board. No order shall be entered by the Board pursuant to this paragraph without any required notice and opportunity for a hearing before the Board as provided by Chapter 536, RSMo.
- J. Unless otherwise specified by the Board, all reports, documentation, notices, or other materials required to be submitted to the Board shall be forwarded to: Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners, P.O. Box 1062, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- K. Any failure by Respondent to comply with any condition of discipline set forth herein constitutes a violation of this Order.

The Board will maintain this Order as an open and public record of the Board as provided in Chapters 328, 329, 610, and 324, RSMo.
