A motion was made by Leata Price-Land and seconded by Kim Marshall to approve the Open Session Agenda. Motion carried.

House Bill 134

The Board discussed some of their concerns with House Bill 134. Some of their concerns are as follows:

The Board has the burden of creating the brochure and self test, however is not charged with regulating the profession;

The hair braiders are not required to have any knowledge of scalp disorders, alopecia, or conditions that could cause hair loss;

Hair braiders should be knowledgeable of infection control/sanitation in the work place;

Why there is a requirement that hair braiders register with the Board when there are no repercussions for not registering;

Would like an understanding as to who the hair braiders answer to;

Would like to understand why the Board would have the burden of registering but not regulating hair braiders;

The Board would have the cost of hiring additional staff to register hair braiders, creating the brochure, test, and inspecting for self tests and brochures;

Does not see in the legislation who determines if the hair braider passes the self test;

The Board can see no purpose for the self test as individuals would be able to pass answers to one another, therefore self test would not be legally defensible;

Questions why the Board would take time and resources to inspect to see if the self test and brochure were available at the location at which such person is engaged in the practice of hair braiding when the Board has no authority to regulate;

Legislation requires no type of education and/or continuing education;

Hair braiders should be required to renew a license such is required by all other cosmetology/barber professions;

Fees should not be outlined in statute;

Does not feel that the law should state that cosmetologists can not be hair braiders but that cosmetologists can braid;

Law does not state that a facility where the hair braiders are working must be a licensed salon;

It is not beneficial of the cosmetology and barber profession to continue to carve out sections of the professions;

The role of the Board is not to write brochures and collect money but to protect the public.

It was the consensus of the Board for Connie Clarkston, Division of Professional Registration Legislative Liaison, to attempt to set-up a meeting with the sponsor of this bill, Representative Nasheed, and for Wayne Kindle to attend the meeting with Connie.

Emily Carroll, Executive Director, stated she would gather data as to the fiscal impact this bill would have on the Board.

Emily Carroll and Earl Kraus, Division Legal Senior Counsel, stated they would meet together to discuss legal issues of the current proposed legislation, and Ms. Carroll stated those issues would be discussed at a later date with the full board.
