The Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners was called to order via conference call in open session by President Wayne Kindle at 4:04 p.m. on Saturday, February 19, 2011 at the Division of Professional Registration, 3605 Missouri Boulevard, Jefferson City, Missouri.

**4:04 p.m.** The meeting was called to order in Open Session

A motion was made by Jacklyn Crow and seconded by Betty Leake to approve the Open Session Agenda. Motion carried.

**Proposed Legislation**

Wayne Kindle stated when he and Connie Clarkston met with Representative Nasheed they reiterated to her the Board's purpose of "protecting the public". He stated Representative Nasheed was led to believe the Board was out to keep individuals from making a living.

Connie Clarkston stated that their discussion with Representative Nasheed also included the Board's concerns that if the Board cannot license hair braiders, why register them with the Board. Representative Nasheed questioned why tattoo artists were not regulated under the Board. Ms. Clarkston stated

there was discussion regarding tattoo artists, hygiene and sanitation, and scalp disorders. Ms. Clarkston stated that the legislation came from the Show-Me Institute and Dave Roland is who the letter came from, who was associated with the Show-Me Institute, not certain if he is still at this time or not.

Representative Nasheed has agreed to having discussions with the hair braider association and with representatives of the Board. Ms. Clarkston stated she believes the Board has made great strides with Representative Nasheed. Ms. Clarkston stated Representative Nasheed commented that "nobody gets all of what they want; there are all sacrifices".

Board members feel hair braiders need to have knowledge on professionalism, the 600 hours required in the proposed legislation was partially due to allow for financial assistance, the Board would like for the grandfathering period to also be a teaching/educational period.

A motion was made by Kim Marshall and seconded by Jacklyn Crow to remove the words "on a regular basis" from section 329.010 (8). Motion carried.

A motion was made by Kim Marshall and seconded by Jasper Kee for Connie Clarkston and Emily Carroll to present the Board's FY12 Proposed Hair Braiding Legislation to the Governor's Office and Representative Lasheed on behalf of the Board. Roll call vote:

Connie Clarkston suggested, and Betty Leake agreed, that the removing of all other proposed language, with the exception of the hair braiding language, could be removed from the Board's FY12 Proposed Hair Braiding Legislation if necessary.

Wayne Kindle suggested that, depending on how the Board's proposed hair braiding legislation progresses, that the Board consider meeting with the school associations to keep them apprised with the Board's legislative process.
