The Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners was called to order via conference call in open session by President Wayne Kindle at 4:05 p.m. on Tuesday, March 29, 2011 at the Division of Professional Registration, 3605 Missouri Boulevard, Jefferson City, Missouri.

A motion was made by Betty Leake and seconded by Kim Marshall to approve the Open Session Agenda. Motion carried.

Legislative Update

Wayne Kindle advised the Board members that when Connie Clarkston, Emily Carroll, and he met with Dave Roland and Representative Nasheed, Dave Roland expressed that he did not feel the 600 hours of required education was appropriate for the hairbraider profession as other states do have fewer requirements and feels hairbraiders should only be required to take sanitation classes and the self examination. Wayne stated he testified during a hearing as to why the Board felt hairbraiders required the 600 hours of education and on the Board's belief that the hairbraiders have adequate knowledge on scalp and skin disorders.

Connie Clarkston advised the Board that Wayne Kindle did an excellent job testifying and presenting during the hearing.

Wayne Kindle stated that the proposed legislation before the Board for review today is amended to require hairbraiders to obtain 300 hours instead of 600 hours of education.

Emily Carroll stated that 16 states require a hairbraiding license, 5 states require 300 hours, and 5 states require over 300 hours of education.

In 329.040.7. of the proposed legislation, the hours to be taught for each subject have been amended for the change in hours, with the removal of the 190 hours of curriculum to be defined by school, 10 hours in professional requirements and ethics, 35 hours in safety and health, 20 hours in hair and scalp disorders and diseases, 40 hours in hair analysis and scalp care, 10 hours in client preparation and consultation, 195 hours in hairbraiding and braid styling, and 10 hours has remained in state law.

Members of the Board agreed that the purpose of the Board is "public protection" and not that of assisting perspective students in gaining financial assistance to attend school, which was one consideration the Board had when proposing the 600 hour requirement.

Emily Carroll stated there are also amendments suggested by the Board's legal counsel; they are: either having the word hairbraiding as one word or two words, but keeping it consistent throughout the legislation; removing the dash between "Class" and "HB" throughout the legislation; removing the word "and" between "cosmetologist" and "no", and removing the word "and" between "manicurist" and "no" in 329.050.1(2); replacing "July 2013" with July 31, 2013"; adding the words "and including" after "until" in 329.050.1(5); replacing "Class-CA cosmetologist" with "Class-CA-hairdressing and manicuring" in 329.050.1(8); replacing "natural hairstyling" with "as required by rule" due to "natural hairstyling" not being defined in statute; replacing "August 28, 2013" in 329.080.5(4) with "July 31, 2013"; replacing "by hair cutting, or application of dyes, reactive chemicals or other preparation to alter the color or alter the structure of the hair" with "as defined in 329.010 (5)(a)-(e) except as expressly permitted in 329.010(9).".

A motion was made by Kim Marshall and seconded by Betty Leake to accept the proposed legislation containing the new 300 hour of education language. Roll call vote:
