

MISSOURI DENTAL BOARD SEDATION APPLICATION INFORMATION

PEDIATRIC MODERATE SEDATION PERMIT

Please refer to the application for a Pediatric Moderate Sedation Permit. Pursuant to Board Rule 20 CSR 2110-4.020, no dentist shall administer pediatric moderate sedation unless the dentist possesses a permit issued by the Missouri Dental Board.

If you wish to apply for a pediatric moderate sedation permit, please complete the enclosed application form and return it to this office with the \$100 permit fee. To verify your education and training, please see the "Verification of Pediatric Moderate Sedation Requirements" form, you will be required to complete Section I of the form and your program director will need to complete Section II and return it directly to this office. You must also document completion of an Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) or Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS). Online only courses will not be accepted to satisfy ACLS or PALS.

Upon receipt of your completed application, \$100 fee, documentation of your education and training, and proof of current ACLS or PALS, your application will be forwarded to our Pediatric Moderate Sedation Committee for review. Upon approval of your application, you will be contacted by a member of the Board staff or a Committee member to schedule an appointment for your on-site evaluation.

In addition, the dental office(s) at which you intend to administer pediatric moderate sedation must have a site certificate issued by the Board. If the dental office(s) does not have a valid site certificate, the dentist-in-charge of the dental office(s) must secure a site certificate before you provide pediatric moderate sedation services.

PEDIATRIC MODERATE SEDATION SITE CERTIFICATE

Please refer to the application for a Pediatric Moderate Sedation Site Certificate. Pursuant to Board Rule 20 CSR 2110-4.020, no dental office shall be the site for the administration of enteral, parenteral, and/or pediatric moderate sedation without being issued a site certificate by the Missouri Dental Board.

If you are the dentist-in-charge of a dental office where pediatric moderate sedation will be administered, please complete the application form and return it to this office with the \$100 permit fee. To qualify for a pediatric moderate sedation site certificate, the dental office must have written protocols for sedation of dental patients in accordance with 20 CSR 2110-4.020 and 20 CSR 2110-4.030 (see the "Affidavit of Written Protocols for Sedation of Dental Patients" form that must be signed by the dentist-in-charge of the dental office and in the presence of a Notary Public). Additionally, all moderate sedation team members, including yourself, must possess certification from a Board-approved course in monitoring sedated patients during the past five (5) years. The dental office must also be properly equipped and maintained in accordance with 20 CSR 2110-4.030 (see Section III of the application form). We must receive documentation that all anesthesia team members, including yourself, possess and maintain current certification in the American Heart Association's Basic Life Support (BLS) for the Healthcare Provider, or Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS). Online only courses will not be accepted to satisfy the BLS requirement or ACLS. A facility inspection of the dental office will

be conducted to confirm the adequacy of the dental office and the qualifications of the sedation team.

APPLICATION FOR ENTERAL MODERATE SEDATION PERMIT

Please refer to the application for an Enteral Moderate Sedation Permit. Pursuant to Board Rule 20 CSR 2110-4.020, no dentist shall administer enteral conscious sedation unless the dentist possesses a permit issued by the Missouri Dental Board.

If you wish to apply for an enteral moderate sedation permit, please complete the application form and return it to this office with the \$100 permit fee and verification of your education and training (see Section II of the application form). Upon receipt of your completed application, \$100 fee, documentation of your education and training, including proof of current ACLS, your permit will be issued if the dental office(s) at which you intend to administer enteral moderate sedation has a site certificate issued by the Board. If the dental office(s) does not have a valid site certificate, the dentist-in-charge of the dental office(s) must secure a site certificate before the Board can issue you an enteral moderate sedation permit.

APPLICATION FOR ENTERAL MODERATE SEDATION SITE CERTIFICATE

Please refer to the application for an Enteral Moderate Sedation Site Certificate. Pursuant to Board Rule 20 CSR 2110-4.020, no dental office shall be the site for the administration of enteral moderate sedation without being issued a site certificate by the Missouri Dental Board.

If you are the dentist-in-charge of a dental office where enteral moderate sedation will be administered, please complete the application form and return it to this office with the \$100 permit fee. To qualify for a enteral moderate sedation site certificate, the dental office must have written protocols for sedation of dental patients in accordance with 20 CSR 2110-4.020 and 20 CSR 2110-4.030 (see the "Affidavit of Written Protocols for Sedation of Dental Patients" form that must be signed by the dentist-in-charge of the dental office and in the presence of a Notary Public). Additionally, all moderate sedation team members, including yourself, must possess certification from a Board-approved course in monitoring sedated patients during the past five (5) years. The dental office must also be properly equipped and maintained in accordance with 20 CSR 2110-4.030 (see Section III of the application form). We must receive documentation that all anesthesia team members, including yourself, possess and maintain current certification in the American Heart Association's Basic Life Support (BLS) for the Healthcare Provider, or Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS). Online only courses will not be accepted to satisfy the BLS requirement or ACLS. A facility inspection of the dental office will be conducted to confirm the adequacy of the dental office and the qualifications of the sedation team.

APPLICATION FOR PARENTERAL MODERATE SEDATION PERMIT

Please refer to the application for a Parenteral Moderate Sedation Permit. Pursuant to Board Rule 20 CSR 2110-4.020, no dentist shall administer parenteral moderate sedation unless the dentist possesses a permit issued by the Missouri Dental Board.

If you wish to apply for a parenteral moderate sedation permit, please complete the application form and return it to this office with the \$100 permit fee. To verify your education and training, please complete Section I of the "Verification of Parenteral Moderate Sedation Requirements" form then send it to your postgraduate program director to be completed and returned directly to

this office. You will be required to complete Section I of the form and your program director will need to complete Section II and return it directly to this office. You must also document completion of an Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS). Online only courses will not be accepted to satisfy ACLS.

Upon receipt of your completed application, \$100 fee, documentation of your education and training, and proof of current ACLS, your application will be forwarded to our Parenteral Moderate Sedation Committee for review. Upon approval of your application, you will be contacted by a member of the Board staff or a Committee member to schedule an appointment for your on-site evaluation.

In addition, the dental office(s) at which you intend to administer parenteral moderate sedation must have a site certificate issued by the Board. If the dental office(s) does not have a valid site certificate, the dentist-in-charge of the dental office(s) must secure a site certificate before the Board can issue you a parenteral moderate sedation permit.

APPLICATION FOR PARENTERAL MODERATE SEDATION SITE CERTIFICATE

Please refer to the attached application for a Parenteral Moderate Sedation Site Certificate. Pursuant to Board Rule 20 CSR 2110-4.020, no dental office shall be the site for the administration of enteral, parenteral, and/or pediatric moderate sedation without being issued a site certificate by the Missouri Dental Board.

If you are the dentist-in-charge of a dental office where parenteral moderate sedation will be administered, please complete the application form and return it to this office with the \$100 permit fee. To qualify for a parenteral moderate sedation site certificate, the dental office must have written protocols for sedation of dental patients in accordance with 20 CSR 2110-4.020 and 20 CSR 2110-4.030 (see the "Affidavit of Written Protocols for Sedation of Dental Patients" form that must be signed by the dentist-in-charge of the dental office and in the presence of a Notary Public). Additionally, all moderate sedation team members, including yourself, must possess certification from a Board-approved course in monitoring sedated patients during the past five (5) years. The dental office must also be properly equipped and maintained in accordance with 20 CSR 2110-4.030 (see Section III of the application form). We must receive documentation that all anesthesia team members, including yourself, possess and maintain current certification in the American Heart Association's Basic Life Support (BLS) for the Healthcare Provider, or Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS). Online only courses will not be accepted to satisfy the BLS requirement or ACLS. A facility inspection of the dental office will be conducted to confirm the adequacy of the dental office and the qualifications of the sedation team.

DEEP SEDATION/GENERAL ANESTHESIA PERMIT

Please refer to the application for a Deep Sedation/General Anesthesia Permit. Pursuant to Board Rule 20 CSR 2110-4.040, no dentist shall administer deep sedation/general anesthesia unless the dentist possesses a permit issued by the Missouri Dental Board.

If you wish to apply for a deep sedation/general anesthesia permit, please complete the application form and return it to this office with the \$100 permit fee. To verify your education and training, please complete Section I of the "Verification of Deep Sedation/General Anesthesia Requirements" form then send it to your postgraduate program director to be

completed and returned directly to this office. You will complete Section I of the form and your residency director completes Section II and returns it directly to this office. You must also document completion of an Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) course or its Board-approved equivalent during the past five (5) years.

Upon receipt of your completed application, \$100 fee, documentation of your education and training, and proof of current ACLS or its Board-approved equivalent, your application will be forwarded to our Deep Sedation/General Anesthesia Committee for review. Upon approval of your application, you will be contacted by a member of the Board staff and/or a Committee member to schedule an appointment for your on-site evaluation. On-site evaluations shall be conducted in accordance with guidelines in the current AAOMS *Office Anesthesia Evaluation Manual*.

In addition, the dental office(s) at which you intend to administer deep sedation/general anesthesia must have a site certificate issued by the Board. If the dental office(s) does not have a valid site certificate, the dentist-in-charge of the dental office(s) must secure a site certificate before the Board can issue you a deep sedation/general anesthesia permit.

DEEP SEDATION/GENERAL ANESTHESIA SITE CERTIFICATE

Please refer to the application for a Deep Sedation/General Anesthesia Site Certificate. Pursuant to Board Rule 20 CSR 2110-4.040, no dental office shall be the site for the administration of deep sedation/general anesthesia without being issued a site certificate by the Missouri Dental Board.

If you are the dentist-in-charge of a dental office where deep sedation/general anesthesia will be administered, please complete the application form and return it to this office with the \$100 permit fee and documentation that all anesthesia team members, including yourself, possess and maintain current certification in the American Heart Association's Basic Life Support (BLS) for the Healthcare Provider, or advanced cardiac life support (ACLS). Online only courses will not be accepted to satisfy the BLS requirement or ACLS. To qualify for a deep sedation/general anesthesia site certificate, the dental office must be properly equipped in accordance with the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (AAOMS) *Office Anesthesia Evaluation Manual*. The dental office must have and maintain personnel capable of handling procedures and emergencies incident to the administration of deep sedation/general anesthesia and undergo and successfully complete a facility inspection. Facility inspections shall be conducted in accordance with guidelines in the current AAOMS *Office Anesthesia Evaluation Manual*.
