### General Instructions for Controlled Substance Prescriptive Authority

---

#### **Who is NOT eligible for Controlled Substance Prescriptive Authority???**

- + Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNA)
- + APRNs who have not completed 1000 hours of clinical practice
- + APRNs who have not completed 300 hours of preceptorial experience in the prescription of drugs, medicines, and therapeutic devices
- + Nurses not currently recognized or applying for recognition as an APRN by the Board of Nursing

#### **Items to be sent to the Board of Nursing Office:**

1. **Complete and submit** the application for controlled substance prescriptive authority
2. **Submit ONE (1)** of the following as evidence of completion of an advanced pharmacology course with preceptorial experience:
  - + Official final transcript from an advanced program
  - + Letter from an advanced program describing how preceptorial experience was integrated into the curriculum
  - + Evidence of completion of 3 credit hours post-baccalaureate advanced pharmacology course from an accredited college/university within the last 5 years.
  - + Evidence of completion of 45 continuing education units (CEUs) in pharmacology in the last 5 years.
3. **Submit** a completed "Statement of Preceptorial Experience, (form provided by the Board), for evidence of 300 clock hours of preceptorial experience in the prescription of drugs, medicines, and therapeutic devices with a qualified preceptor. A qualified preceptor is defined as an APRN with a current unrestricted RN license who has a scope of practice which includes prescribing and has met the requirements for prescriptive authority; a licensed physician with unrestricted prescriptive authority.
4. **Submit** a completed "Statement of Practice in APRN category" (on bottom of Statement of Preceptorial Experience page) for evidence of 1000 hours of clinical experience in the advanced practice nursing category. Clinical hours completed during the educational program may not be included.
5. **Submit** a completed "Statement of Controlled Substance Delegation", form provided by the Board.

Please **provide us with your email address** so we can notify you when your eligibility has been completed. Once the Board has received and approved the documents listed above, you will then be ready to register with the Missouri Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs (BNDD) and the Federal Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA).

There is no renewal or expiration date assigned to Controlled Substance Prescriptive Authority eligibility issued by the Board of Nursing. However, this privilege may be removed as a result of disciplinary action, lapse of the RN license and/or lapse of the Document of Recognition or the removal of registration by BNDD or DEA.
