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APPOINTMENT OF MARGARET A. DROSTE AS
ASSOCIATE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

It is with pride and pleasure that the members of the Missouri State Board of Nursing announce the appointment of Miss Margaret A. Droste, R.N., as Associate Executive Secretary effective July 21, 1969.

Miss Droste received her basic nursing education at St. John's Mercy Hospital School of Nursing in St. Louis, received a bachelors degree in nursing from St. Louis University and a masters of science degree in Medical-Surgical Nursing from Washington University.

Miss Droste has had experience as a staff nurse, instructor, and assistant director of a diploma school. Her position prior to joining the staff of the Board of Nursing was Chairman, Department of Nursing, Mercy Junior College, St. Louis.

Miss Droste has been active in the professional organizations. Currently she holds the office of President of the Missouri League for Nursing, is a member of the Executive Committee of Missouri Nursing Futurama and has recently served as an accreditation visitor, Department of Associate Degree Programs, National League for Nursing.

Mrs. Judith James, R.N., who joined the staff on a temporary, part-time basis pending the appointment of a full-time Associate Executive Secretary, will continue to assist the Board of Nursing with the administration of the licensing examinations.

FACULTY RECORDS

Faculty record forms, which are to be completed for new faculty members and submitted within one month of appointment to the Board of Nursing office, are available

upon request from the Board of Nursing office.

DEFINITION OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER

The Nursing Practice Act of Missouri requires that the applicant for a license to practice as a professional registered nurse or as a practical nurse shall submit to the Missouri State Board of Nursing written evidence of age, of good moral character, and of good physical and mental health.

At their meeting on April 22-23, 1969 the members of the Missouri State Board of Nursing established the policy that an individual convicted of a felony is not considered to be of good moral character and therefore is not eligible to write the State Board Test Pool Examination for licensure in Missouri as a registered professional nurse or as a licensed practical nurse and is not eligible for licensure in Missouri by endorsement from another state.

This decision was reached after many hours of careful deliberation and after discussions at several meetings of the members of the Board of Nursing with the Assistant Attorney General assigned to the Board of Nursing. The members of the Board of Nursing established this policy with the advice and consent of the Assistant Attorney General assigned to the Board of Nursing.

STATE BOARD TEST POOL EXAMINATION FOR
REGISTERED NURSES

Series 669 of the NLN State Board Test Pool Examination will be administered to all candidates in all jurisdictions beginning June 1, 1969. Series 669 will be administered for one year and will be replaced with a new series beginning June 1, 1970.

Since Series 669 has not been administered previously, scores for this examination will be delayed because of standardization which occurs when a new examination is introduced.

Standardization will take place at the National League for Nursing during the last week of July 1969. Scores will be released to state boards two weeks after July 31 or on approximately August 15. We anticipate that licenses will be issued within two weeks after the scores are received which will be approximately August 29.

PROPOSED CHANGES IN NURSING PRACTICE ACT
