REPORT OF COUNCIL OF STATE  
BOARDS OF NURSING MEETING, MAY 13-15, 1975

Actions taken relating to the State Board Test Pool Examination included:

We do hope that the individuals concerned will be made aware of the fact that the Board of Nursing has no control over the dates of the administration of the State Board Test Pool Examinations. The testing dates for the administration of the State Board Test Pool Examinations were adopted by the Council of State Boards of Nursing when it held its 29th annual business meeting on May 13-15, 1975 and meeting these testing dates, which is on a national basis, is one of the criterion needed to be met

by a jurisdiction to contract for the use of the State Board Test Pool Examinations. The measure was taken by the Council of State Boards in order to assure security of the nursing examinations.

We are sure that the schools and nurses of Missouri would not tolerate a change in the type of licensing examination administered in Missouri because any nurse not writing the State Board Test Pool Examination would then have to write it in the state that he/she moves to in order to practice nursing in that state as Missouri licensees would no longer be mobile in regards to the reciprocity of licensure.

While we're interested in the welfare of all candidates, The Board of Nursing is not responsible for food, lodging and parking facilities for candidates. Preferred list of facilities and accommodations will be sent to schools and candidates for the convenience of the candidates.

### Board Briefs

#### NEW LICENSING PROCESS

A new automated license renewal process has been implemented in the Division of Professional Registration. Your renewal application has room for your Missouri license number and signature to insure the right person returning the renewal. The 1976 Registered and Licensed Practical Nurse Survey form submitted by the Division of Health of Missouri and American Nurses' Association for statistical studies is not required for relicensure. You will find that most have been partially filled in by the computer from the information you furnished last year. There is also an order blank for a copy of currently licensed nurses in Missouri which will be in directory form. The pre-addressed envelope enclosed is for you to return the renewal application and nurse survey with \$5.00 fee to the Board office. Your certificate of registration for the fiscal year July 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977 is perpetuated by the computer and will be ready for mailing in approximately two weeks time after receipt. Renewal certificates are issued only to those who renew and remit fee. The order blank for Commercial Printing Company is enclosed in the event you wish to order a Directory of nurses currently licensed in Missouri. Section 161.242 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri (1969) require the publication of this directory and we are charged with carrying out that mandate. Should you believe that such a directory, containing public information, should not be published, you may seek through the legislature the repeal of this and several related statutes.

#### THE NURSING PRACTICE ACT

Attached is Senate Bill 108, enacted by the 78th General Assembly of the State of Missouri. This is the new Nursing Practice Act; the Board advises every nurse to become familiar with it as it is the law that governs your profession. We regret that we shall not be able to supply more than one copy on request until an adequate supply has been received by the Board. The printing requires the bidding process, etc. Please feel free to reproduce copies. We wish to caution you to make sure that you are using Senate Bill 108 as indicated. (Truly Agreed To And Finally Passed) rather than an earlier Senate Bill 108.

### MORATORIUM ON NEW SCHOOLS

A moratorium on the initiation of new programs in professional and practical nursing education in Missouri was set by the Board at the June, 1975, meeting, until qualified faculty and additional facilities are available. The moratorium was reconsidered at the February 1976, meeting and will be reconsidered following the review of the Annual Renewal of Accreditation Reports at the May 11-14, 1976, Board meeting.

### AMENDMENTS IN MINIMUM STANDARDS

At the November, 1975, meeting the Board made the following amendments in the Minimum Standards for Professional and Practical Nursing.

1. Fees for examination and licensure stating that fees are non-refundable; and for the examinations non-refundable nor applicable to future examinations.
2. That birth certificates will no longer be required to be submitted to the Board of Nursing with the application to write the examination, nor will a marriage certificate or divorce decree be specified as the legal document for name change.
3. Preliminary Applications will no longer be used for intercountry licensure.
4. Format for Application Procedure was revised to conform with the Professional Minimum Standards.
5. The titling of Procedure elaborated to read Requirements for Missouri licensure.

### FEE NON-REFUNDABLE

At the September Board meeting the decision was rendered that application for licensure by examination or fees submitted to the Board accompanying applications will not be refundable (or transferrable to another examination) because all monies submitted to the State belongs to the State and are deposited to the State upon request.

### BOARD POSITION ON EMPLOYMENT OF NEW GRADUATES

The members of the Board of Nursing adopted the following position at the November 17-19, 1975, meeting:

That new graduates should work under supervision only,  
until licensure has been completed.

### MISSOURI STATE BOARD OF NURSING CONTINUED ON U.S. COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION LIST OF STATE AGENCIES RECOGNIZED FOR THE APPROVAL OF NURSE EDUCATION

We are extremely pleased to inform you that the Commissioner of Education's Advisory Committee on Accreditation and Institutional Eligibility reviewed the Board's petition for renewal of recognition as a State agency for the approval of nurse education

on September 16-19, 1975. (Miss Cuddy and Miss Meinecke appeared before Subcommittee 2 of the Committee at Arlington, Virginia for an oral presentation).

On December 11, T. H. Bell, U. S. Commissioner of Education, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D.C., wrote the Board "At its meeting on September 16-19, 1975, the Advisory Committee on Accreditation and Institutional Eligibility examined the petition of the Missouri State Board of Nursing for continued recognition as a State agency for the approval of nurse education within the meaning of 42 U.S.C. 298(b), as amended. On the basis of evidence submitted in conformity with the criteria published in the Federal Register of January 16, 1969, the Committee has recommended that recognition of the Board be continued for a period of three years.

In making its recommendation, the Committee noted that the 1969 Criteria, under which the Board was reviewed, are in need of revision. The Committee suggested that if such revision is undertaken, it would wish to implement the revised Criteria by reviewing all recognized agencies as soon as possible. In addition, the Nurse Training Act (42 U.S.C. 298 (b) ), as amended, is due to expire, and may require amendments which might change the nature of the Commissioner's recognition. For these reasons the Committee, while finding the Board to be in satisfactory compliance with the Criteria, recommended that recognition of the Board be limited to three years.

I concur with the recommendation of the Committee and am pleased to inform you that the Missouri State Board of Nursing will be continued on the Commissioner's List of State Agencies Recognized for the Approval of Nurse Education. Questions regarding continuance of recognition beyond the three-year period should be address to Mr. John Proffitt, Director, Accreditation and Institutional Eligibility Staff, Bureau of Postsecondary Education.

Please accept my warm congratulations to the Board for its achievement."

## RECOGNITION OF STATE AGENCIES

For purposes of determining eligibility for United States Government assistance under certain legislation, the U.S. Commissioner of Education is required to publish lists of State agencies for approval of public postsecondary vocational education, and for approval of nurse education, which he has determined to be reliable authorities concerning the quality of education or training offered by educational institutions or programs. State agencies desiring to be listed by the Commissioner of Education must submit petitions for recognition demonstrating compliance with the relevant criteria contained in this document. All petitions are received and reviewed by the Accreditation and Institutional Eligibility Staff, Bureau of Postsecondary Education, which, among its other duties, provides administrative services to the Commissioner of Education's Advisory Committee on Accreditation and Institutional Eligibility.

### Advisory Committee on Accreditation and Institutional Eligibility

The Commissioner's Advisory Committee on Accreditation and Institutional Eligibility was established in May, 1968, and is chartered under the Federal Advisory Committee Act (P.L. 92-463). It is composed of 15 members selected from various segments of the secondary and postsecondary community, the student/youth population, State departments of education, professional associations and the general public. The Committee functions to assist the Commissioner of Education in the performance of eligibility determining duties imposed by P.L. 82-550, the Veteran's Readjustment Assistance Act of 1952, and subsequent legislation. It also serves to advise him on broader policy matters and specific issues relating to accreditation, and institutional eligibility for Federal funding.

The eight state Boards listed are:

California, Iowa, Louisiana, Missouri, Montana, New Hampshire, New York,  
and West Virginia.

### SENATE BILL 58

We would like to share the following information with you which we have taken out of context from the "Missouri Register Code of State Regulations", Rule Making Manual, James C. Kirkpatrick, Secretary of State. (Permission granted by Secretary of State Kirkpatrick).

"...Senate Bill 58 was passed by the first regular session of the 78th General Assembly and signed by the governor on July 15, 1975. It sets up two publications, the monthly Missouri Register and the compilation of rules known as the Code of State Regulations, both of which are to be published by the secretary of state.

### PROVISIONS OF SENATE BILL 58

We do not attempt to cover all the provisions of SB 58 in this booklet, for some are outside the scope of publication of rules.

After Jan. 1, 1976, the procedures outlined in SB 58 are the exclusive means by which administrative rules may be promulgated in Missouri. It requires publication in the Missouri Register of the entire text of any new rules, amendments or repeals before the rules can have legal effect. They are published first as a Notice of Proposed Rule Making. That Notice is required to contain:

- a) an explanation of any new rule or any change in an existing rule and the reasons therefore;
- b) the legal authority pursuant to which the rule is proposed to be made;
- c) the text of the entire rule proposed to be made or the entire text of any affected section or subsection of a rule which is proposed to be amended with all new matter underlined or printed in bold face type and with all deleted matter placed in brackets, except that when a proposed amendment is to correct a typographical or printing error, or merely to make a technical change not affecting substantive matters, the amendment may be described in general terms without reprinting the entire rule, section or subsection;
- d) the number and general subject matter of any rule proposed to be rescinded;
- e) notice that anyone may file a statement in support of, or in opposition to, the proposed rule at a specified place and within a specified time not less than 20 days after publication of the Notice of Proposed Rule Making in the Missouri Register;
- f) notice of the time and place of a hearing on the proposed rule making if a hearing is ordered, which hearing shall be not less than 20 days after publication of the Notice of Proposed Rule Making in the Missouri Register; or a statement that no hearing has been ordered if such is the case.

After the Notice of Proposed Rule Making is published, the next step is public comment or a hearing. Senate Bill 58 does not add additional requirements for hearings. 536.020 (3) RSMo (Supp. 1975). But neither does it prohibit them, and it should be remembered that public access and comment is one of the goals of SB 58.

A 60 day period begins to run after the expiration of time for filing comments or the date of a hearing. Sometime within that 60 day period, the agency must make a final determination of what the content of the rule will be and file it with the secretary of state, "either putting the proposed rule into effect, with or without changes, or withdrawing the proposed rule." This is termed an Order of Rule Making. It will be published in the Register...

The Board filed its rules with the Secretary of State in accordance with the Missouri Register Code of State Regulations on March 11, 1976.

The Minimum Standards for Accredited Programs of Professional and Practical Nursing are rules.
