

NURSING PRACTICE ACT, CHAPTER 335.066 - DENIAL, SUSPENSION OR
REVOCAION OF LICENSES

The Board of Nursing, at four regularly scheduled meetings, and one special called meeting, reviewed individual professional nurse problems and individual practical nurse problems related to the issuance or renewal of licenses due to complaints against the applicants for the 1979-1980 year. The Board ordered the following disciplinary action:

Because of questions I would like to give you an overview of how complaints against practicing nurses are handled. When a written complaint is received in this office (i.e. a nursing director notifies us she has fired a licensed employee because of suspicion of drug abuse or incompetency or any other violation of the Nursing Practice Act) we immediately request an investigation. This is done by a well qualified discrete staff of investigators who gather as much information as is available. At the next regularly scheduled Board meeting the investigative report is presented. If, in the Board's opinion, the complaint and evidence merits further action, our legal counsel files a complaint with the Administrative Hearing Commission. This Commission conducts a legal court hearing and makes recommendations based upon evidence and legal statutes to the Board. The Board then conducts a disciplinary hearing and takes action upon the individual's license. It is a long process at times but is a system designed to afford protection for all involved. We encourage you to report any happenings concerning impostors or a licensed RN or LPN which you feel warrants Board attention.

NEW POLICIES

The Missouri State Board of Nursing will now accept a passing score on the Canadian Nurses Association Testing Service examination as comparable to the State Board Test Pool Examination.

Persons with a basic nursing education (ADN or BSN) from the New York Regents External Degree Program can now become licensed in Missouri by examination or endorsement based upon a ruling made at the October Board meeting. Dr. Carrie Lenburg from the New York Program spoke to the Board. (October 22, 1980)

All R.N. or L.P.N. licenses that are not renewed within sixty (60) days of the designated date, July 1, will be considered lapsed. For a period of two (2) years, these lapsed licenses may be reactivated by petition to the Board of Nursing office. Thereafter, evidence of current knowledge of nursing (including but not limited to: evidence of work in nursing in another state or country or evidence of nursing continuing education) must be provided in writing to the Board, and ruled upon individually.

NOTICE TO SCHOOLS

Many calls have been coming into the office from schools wishing to change clinical facilities for various reasons. May we suggest that you form alternate plans for clinical facilities prior to the beginning of classes. This would expedite the signing of clinical facility agreements and prevent panic when it is suddenly discovered there are not enough patients for the students. Included below is a sample co-operative agreement to be signed between schools utilizing the same facility.

GREETINGS FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

What an exciting place to be - the State Board of Nursing office! And what an exciting group to be associated with - the nurses of the state of Missouri. Your support and assistance in the first months of my position as Executive Director has been appreciated and I am looking forward to a long and productive association with all of you.

It has been asked of me "What do you do?" so I would like to try and give an overview of daily activities. The office is a bee hive of activity as we daily deal with licensure endorsement from other states and countries. My mail consists of numerous requests for information and assistance - from the newspaper reporters covering the nursing shortage to the new graduates wondering about the limits of her practice. I act as a fact finding person in order to present as much information as possible to the Board when they meet in regular session.

The Board is an innovative group who have your well-being and the public's protection as top priorities. Currently they are revising the Minimum Standards which govern the professional nursing schools in the state. In 1981 we will be conducting public hearings concerning the proposed revisions, and need your input.

The Board at its October meeting unanimously decided to accept candidates graduating with a basic ADN or BSN education from the New York Regents External Degree Program. Previously, nurses with this educational background were ineligible to sit for the State Board Test Pool Examination or to be licensed by endorsement in Missouri. The Board also unanimously decided to accept passage of the Canadian Nurse's Association Testing Service examination as equivalent to the State Board Test Pool Examination in Missouri. This will expedite the licensing of Canadian nurses in Missouri.

The next legislative session promises to deal with items of interest for nursing. Yes - the Nursing Practice Act will be opened because it is in the section of law dealing with state reorganization which is again being refined. The current feeling is that there will be no major revisions introduced to our practice act. The majority of nurses in the state seem satisfied with the law as it now stands and remember how hard we worked to get it in its present form. I will keep a close eye on the legislative arena and keep you informed.

The Missouri State Board of Nursing is a valuable asset to nurses and nursing practice. We wish to be of service to you. Please do not hesitate to call upon us. If you do not have a copy of the Nursing Practice Act I urge you to contact us and request one. It is the legal statute which governs your practice and the decisions the State Board renders. I look forward to working with you.
