Regular Board Meetings are held at the Division of Professional Registration, 3523 North Ten Mile Drive, Jefferson City, Missouri, beginning at 8:30 a.m. each day, unless otherwise designated. Meetings are open to the public, except for discussion of licensure disciplinary problems. A Public Agenda is published for each meeting.

If you drive from the eastern part of the state via I-70, exit at the Kingdom City, Highway 54 West, State Capitol Exit. Proceed to Jefferson City via Highway 54 West, cross the bridge and take the Highway 50 West (Sedalia) Exit. Proceed on Highway 50 West to the second stop light, turn right onto North Ten Mile Drive. Our office is located in a metal, cream-colored building, .08 of a mile north of the Capital Mall.

If you drive from the western part of the state via I-70, exit at the Highway 63 South, Jefferson City Exit in Columbia and proceed into Jefferson City via Highway 63 South. After crossing the bridge, proceed as above.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE

The Board Office is receiving numerous applications from nurses who are currently working as R.N.'s or L.P.N.'s in this state, without being licensed or in receipt of a temporary permit to practice. At its April meeting, the Board denied licensure to two registered nurse applicants because of the fact they had worked in this state (one for 8 months and one for 11 months) and represented themselves as R.N.'s without being licensed.

The definitions of practical nursing and professional nursing contain the phrase "is the performance for compensation". Before a nurse begins employment to work as an R.N. or L.P.N. (this includes orientation), that nurse must hold a Missouri license or a temporary permit to practice. There is no grace period in the State of Missouri. Section 335.076 states:

"No person shall practice or offer to practice professional nursing or practical nursing in this state for compensation or use any title, sign, abbreviation, card or device to indicate that such person is a practicing professional nurse or practical nurse, unless he has been duly licensed under the provisions of section 335.011 to 335.096."

Violation of this or any provision of the Nursing Practice Act is a Class A Misdemeanor.

Likewise, any graduate (Missouri or otherwise) who is writing or has written the examination in another state, must apply for and be issued a Graduate Temporary Permit, prior to employment. Any graduate (Missouri or otherwise) who is writing or has written the examination in Missouri may be employed without a Graduate Temporary Permit, since they are covered by an exemption clause, Chapter 335.081(6), RSMo 1978.

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

The Board published a proposed amendment to 4 CSR 200-5.010 Definitions (1)(B), which read:

"The word 'prescribed' as it is used in section 335.016(8)(c), RSMo, means that there may not be any individual, who is not a nurse licensed in this state, or who is not licensed in this state to prescribe the particular medication or treatment to be administered, in the chain of communication between the individual who prescribes the medication or treatment and the professional nurse who administers the medication or treatment."

After receiving and reviewing numerous comments in opposition, the proposed amendment was rescinded by the Board.

After receiving input from the practical nurse educators through the state, concerning the phrase included in the practical nurse minimum standards reading "The length of the program shall be one (1) calendar year," the Board will submit the following proposed rule change: 4 CSR 200-3.100 (3)(A) "The program shall meet the (4) Curriculum Requirements and be completed within twenty-four (24) months."

The proposed amendment will be published in the June 1 Missouri Register with a comment period until June 30, 1983.

Sermchief v. Gonzales: The Missouri State Board of Nursing was granted leave to file an Amicus Curaie Brief in the case of Sermchief v. Gonzales. That brief has been filed and speaks to the following points:

1. The definition of professional nursing found in 335.016(8) RSMo 1978, is a broad definition and the question for determination in this case is whether or not the practice of the plaintiff nurses falls within the limits of this definition, given its broadest interpretation.
2. The court must determine the meaning of the term "nursing diagnosis" which is found in 335.016(8)(B), RSMo 1978, in order to decide whether or not the conduct of the plaintiff nurses was the practice of professional nursing as defined in 335.016(8), RSMo 1978.
3. The court must establish guidelines to enable professional nurses and those licensed to prescribe medications and treatments, to know when a medication and treatment has been prescribed in such a way that the professional nurse may administer the medication or treatment under 335.016(8)(C), RSMo 1978.

Letters of Commendation

A letter of commendation was sent by the Board to the Kennett Practical Nursing Program for having the highest mean score in the state for the October 1982 NCLEX-PN.

A letter of commendation was also sent by the Board to Southeast Missouri State University, Baccalaureate Program, for having the highest mean score in the state for the February 1983 NCLEX-RN.

NEWS ITEM: The Board of Nursing will hold additional meetings at various sites through the state in order to give more nurses a chance to personally interact with the Board and discuss and review issues affecting nurses and nursing practice. These meetings will not exceed two days in length and will take the place of two days of regularly scheduled board meetings. The Board hopes that nurses throughout the state will take advantage of this opportunity and feel free to come and discuss nursing issues. The place and date for these meetings has not been determined at this point. Watch the Newsletter following the July meeting for more specific details.

Disciplinary hearings and school matters will be agenda items for the regularly scheduled meeting dates to be conducted at the Board of Nursing Office in Jefferson City.

NEWS ITEM: St. Louis Community College at Meramec and St. Joseph's Hospital in Kirkwood have been named one of five demonstration centers to participate in the "Associate Degree Nursing--Facilitating Competency Development" project, sponsored by the Midwest Alliance in Nursing (MAIN) Indianapolis, and is part of a six-million dollar W.K. Kellogg Foundation Grant. The grant has been provided to address major issues in Associate Degree Nursing Education and Practice. The project has been funded for three years and is coordinated from Grand View College, Des Moines, Iowa. Peggy Primm, R.N., Ph.D., Head of the Division of Nursing, Grand View College and former member of the State Board of Nursing, is Project Director. Project Coordinator is Carol Vanderford, R.N., M.S.N., Assistant Professor of Nursing, Grand View College.

NEWS ITEM: A letter was received from a school director questioning the educational theories and/or rationale for including unrecognizable "sample" questions throughout each official NCLEX-RN and NCLEX-PN examination. This letter was forwarded to the National Council of State Boards of Nursing and a response was received from Ray Showalter, R.N., M.S., Associate Executive Director. A portion of that letter reads as follows:

"Imbedding try-out items in standardized examinations is an acceptable psychometric technique that is utilized in national examination programs other than the National Council Licensure Examination for Nurses (NCLEX). According to the psychometricians of the Council's test service, CTB/McGraw Hill, it is the only acceptable method for securing statistical data on the try-out items. When candidates have try-out items identified for them, they tend not to give accurate attention to them because they do not understand the necessity for accurate data."

The Missouri State Board of Nursing is in agreement with the answer received from the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, Inc.

Letters of Warning and Change in Accreditation Status:

Following the February 1983 NCLEX-RN Examination, Trenton Junior College had a failure rate that exceeded 20% and a mean score less than one standard deviation above the passing score. As a result, Trenton Junior College received a letter of warning from the Board.

Southeast Missouri State University, Associate Degree in Nursing Program, received its second consecutive letter of warning from the Board for a February, 1983, failure rate that exceeded 20% and a mean score of less than one standard deviation above the mean score. The Board has placed Southeast Missouri State University Associate Degree in Nursing Program on Conditional Accreditation. The program will remain on the Conditional Accreditation status until the NCLEX-RN results reach an acceptable level, or until the Board takes further action.

Missouri Hospital Association, et al., vs. Department of Social Services, et al.: A decision was received from James McHenry, Circuit Judge of Cole County, Missouri, in this suit. The Board had entered an Amicus Curiae in this case as the Defendant-Intervenor. The Order issued on March 24, 1983, reads in part:

"The Court finds and declares, adjudges, orders and decrees that the provisions of subsection (5) (7) and (8) of section 335.016 RSMo 1978, do not permit a duly licensed practical nurse, who has been properly trained and who is under the direction of a duly registered professional nurse or a licensed physician to administer fluids intravenously."

DISCIPLINARY HEARINGS HELD AT APRIL 25-29, 1983 BOARD MEETING

1. Linda Jane Fecht Salts, R.N. #45424. REVOKE. Ms. Salts misappropriated drugs from hospital supplies and falsified hospital records, and administered the drugs to herself, while on duty as an R.N.
2. Mark Aymer Lucas, R.N. #63200. REVOKE. Mr. Lucas was addicted to controlled substances and worked as a nurse while under the influence of controlled substances.
3. Elizabetha Cage, LPN #21763. REVOKE. Ms. Cage repeatedly signed out medication for particular patients but did not record that information in the patients' charts. Ms. Cage was terminated from a hospital because of many discrepancies in narcotic and patient records.
4. Mary Elizabeth Johnson Shannon, LPN #18731. REVOKE. Ms. Shannon was convicted of a Class A Felony of Assault in the 1st Degree, received sentence of twelve (12) years.
5. Debbie A. Swanson Lupardus, LPN #23784 - REVOKE, IMPOSITION OF REVOCATION STAYED, LICENSE PLACED ON PROBATION FOR THREE YEARS 5/2/83 to 5/2/85. Ms. Lupardus falsified narcotic records by documenting she had administered certain dosages of Demerol to patients when in fact, she had administered less. Passed out while on duty at a hospital.
6. Carolyn Sue Nichols Crook, LPN #25476. REVOKE. Ms. Crook misappropriated quantities of Demerol from hospital supplies, falsified hospital records, administered the Demerol to herself and was unable to voluntarily discontinue administration of Demerol to herself.
