REFLECTIONS

The telephone calls that come from you to me at the Board office keep me apprised of your expressed interests and concerns. In turn, I endeavor to convey what I hear and learn from you to the members of the Board. Some of the recent trends of these calls and a few of my thoughts follow.

Not surprisingly, with the passage of House Bill 564 which was signed by the Governor on 7/1/93 and became effective on 8/28/93, I have received a number of calls about the Bill's "collaborative practice" portion and what the language means to the practice of registered professional nurses in Missouri, particularly advanced practice nurses. In order to avoid being misled by word of mouth, I encourage those who call to obtain their own copies of this House Bill. You may call the House Post Office, (314) 751-4555, to request a copy of House Bill 564. The approximate pages of interest in the Bill that relate to "collaborative practice" are page 12 and pages 41-61. The language in these pages, in the Nurse Specialty Titles Rule, in the Nursing Practice Act (1993), and in the Sermchief v. Gonzales case [660 S. W. 2d 683 (MO. banc 1983)] are some of the currently available law/rule-related information that pertain to advanced practice nursing in Missouri.

Employers of nurses and nurse employees, alike, call with various scope of practice questions. Sometimes I am able to provide public information from the Board related to the caller's question. Such public information comes from past practice decisions of the Board based upon someone having submitted a specific nurse-client-situation question from his/her facility. Admittedly there are two disclaimers I must address when I share a past decision: (1) generalization to another situation/circumstance is not appropriate, and (2) past decisions do not necessarily reflect current or future Board decisions. Nevertheless, I find that callers appreciate knowing if a somewhat

similar scope of practice question has been addressed by the Board before. I also encourage callers to submit their specific practice questions to the Board. Addressing such written requests becomes part of the work of the Board's Practice Committee. Several weeks prior to each Board meeting, a Practice Committee agenda is available that identifies the questions to be addressed during their upcoming committee meeting. The Practice Committee's recommendations regarding each practice question are then reviewed at the subsequent Full Board meeting and final decisions for each question are determined.

Registered professional nurses and licensed practical nurses call the Board office from time to time with questions that demonstrate their sense of accountability and role responsibilities in practice. These nurses verbalize, within their inquiries, their concerns for both their patients' safety and wellbeing as well as their own professional welfare. Similarly, employers of nurses call requesting information that may assist them in working with nurse employees who are impaired (e.g., practice deficits, chemical dependency).

Possibly related to health care system demands, another area of questions concern the use of unlicensed personnel in various health care settings. There are three pieces of information I suggest during these calls, namely, the position statements on unlicensed assistive personnel of the a) Board of Nursing (Winter '92 Newsletter), b) Missouri Nurses Association, and c) American Nurses Association.

Thank you for your calls. I value my telephone and in-person contacts with you.

INNER-CITY ASTHMA OUTREACH PROGRAMS A SUCCESS

With proper medical diagnosis and management, many of the reported 5,000

asthma-related deaths that occur each year could be prevented. Minorities, particularly African-Americans living in the inner cities, account for disproportionate numbers of those who have asthma and those who die from it.

The urgency of this problem prompted the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) of the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to fund the National Cooperative Inner-city Asthma Study. This network of eight research sites was established to design and evaluate a comprehensive intervention program to reduce the number of asthmatic episodes and asthma-related deaths among children, particularly African-Americans and Hispanics living in urban areas.

The research sites, situated in these hard-hit areas, also may serve as up-to-date information sources for the health care workers and people of their communities. "In addition to supporting collaborative basic and clinical research, we strongly urge all of our center grantees to sponsor and participate in education and community outreach programs," says Robert A. Goldstein, MD, PhD, director of NIAID's Division of Allergy, Immunology, and Transplantation (DAIT).

Thus far, NIAID and two research sites - Albert Einstein College of Medicine and Mount Sinai School of Medicine - have cosponsored a 1-day seminar in New York City entitled "Future Directions in the Management of Asthma and Allergic Diseases," with more than 300 health care workers attending.

A similar workshop for health care professionals took place at Case Western Reserve University's Rainbow Babies' and Children's Hospital in Cleveland, Ohio. The following day, this site hosted a program to acquaint children and their parents, teachers, and friends with the latest information about asthma treatment.

An event at Howard University in Washington, DC, cosponsored by NIAID brought together 500 children with asthma and allergies and their parents and teachers for a day of learning and fun. "NIAID views the

Howard University program, "Asthma Awareness Day for Family and Friends," as a model educational component for asthma and allergy management," says Lawrence J. Prograis, MD, deputy director of DAIT.

Another network site, the Asthma and Allergy Center at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Md, has held continuing medical education workshops and is making plans for community outreach during 1993.

As research through NIAID continues, make your support known. Participate in the research programs and let your congressman on Capitol Hill know that you think the work at these NIAID research centers is important and should be supported.

JOINING FORCES TO COMBAT INNER-CITY ASTHMA

The National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) and the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute (NHLBI) are joining the American Academy of Allergy and Immunology (AAAI) in a program to train minority individuals - high school, college undergraduate,

graduate, and medical students; postdoctoral trainees; and investigators - to work in the field of asthma, allergy, and immunologic diseases. The hope is to increase the number of physicians practicing in inner cities and to attract basic and clinical researchers from the minority community.

This is one of several initiatives undertaken by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to address the issue of asthma, particularly as it affects minorities. By working with the AAAI, the NIH strengthens its effort to reach underrepresented minority populations.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING RELEASES OF INFORMATION

In order for the Missouri State Board of Nursing to provide information from a licensee's file which is not available -

- a. under the Mandatory Reporting Rule, or
- b. as a matter of public record,

a release bearing an original signature of the licensee authorizing the Missouri State Board of Nursing to release information must be received. A release reflecting a copy of the signature is not sufficient.

Failure to provide an original signed release may result in the Missouri State Board of Nursing not being able to facilitate your request for information.

REQUESTS FOR VERIFICATION OF LICENSES

The Board of Nursing recently decided to refrain from verifying the license of an individual as being "in good standing". It was determined that the Board does not have an established definition for the term "in good standing", therefore, whenever a call is received requesting verification of a license, the caller will be notified as to whether or not the license is current, inactive, lapsed, on probation or is suspended. If the license is under a form of discipline, you will receive a return call with that specific information.

INVESTIGATOR IDENTIFICATION

The Missouri State Board of Nursing has on staff a Chief Investigator, two (2) full-time field investigators and in addition has employed the services since October 15, 1993 of five (5) contract investigators for field work.

All investigators conducting business for the Missouri State Board of Nursing have been provided with picture identification cards. All investigators have been instructed to exhibit their picture ID to identify themselves at each entry into any facility where they conduct business. They have also been instructed to present their picture ID as identification to any person(s) they intend to interview in the course of performing their duties.

A verbal explanation or presentation of a business card from an investigator for identification purposes is not acceptable. The only exceptions to this procedure would be when the investigator schedules appointments by telephone, or occasionally it is more expedient and cost effective to conduct telephone interviews.

GRACE PERIODS

RENEWAL - RN licenses must be renewed no later than April 30 of each year and LPNs no later than May 31 of each year. There is no "grace period" which will extend the time for licensure renewal past the expiration date. Any nurse who has not renewed by these dates may not continue to work. There is a grace period which has been established by the Board which deals with fees for late renewal. There is a 30 day grace period following the end of the renewal period during which the late penalty fee does not have to be paid. REMEMBER THIS DOES NOT ALLOW A LICENSEE TO CONTINUE TO PRACTICE NURSING.

EXAMINATION - There is another grace period which concerns new graduate nurses who have received results from Board examinations. All graduates who have been approved to write the examination in Missouri and who have been approved by the Board to be licensed in Missouri are licensed after passing the examination. These graduates receive their results and a letter which states they are now legally eligible to practice nursing in Missouri as an RN or LPN whichever applies. The period of exempted practice for new graduates ends on the day results are received; thus the new graduates must be in possession of a license or a document confirming legal practice in the state where examinations were written in order to continue working in Missouri. The Board recognizes that for new graduates who have written the examination in another state it takes time to get this documentation of successful examination results into the Board office in order that a temporary permit for practice as a licensed nurse can be issued. Therefore, the Board established a 30 day grace period for new graduates who have written their examination in another state who have their new license or a copy of the results of the examination and the required documentation from the state in which they wrote the examination confirming that they are now eligible to practice as a licensed nurse. After receiving this documentation a temporary permit will be issued and the licensure process will proceed.

If a graduate has not submitted the required documentation to the Board office within the 30 day grace period, they must cease working immediately and not return to work until they have the necessary permit. THE BOARD ENCOURAGES ALL EMPLOYERS TO CALL THE BOARD OF NURSING OFFICE IF YOU HAVE QUESTIONS REGARDING THE STATUS OF ANY EMPLOYEE OR PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEE. WE ARE ALWAYS HAPPY TO VERIFY TO YOU THE STATUS OF THESE INDIVIDUALS IN ORDER TO PREVENT UNLICENSED PRACTICE IN THE STATE OF MISSOURI. PLEASE PHONE 314-751-0681.

NOTICE OF ADDITION TO NURSING PRACTICE ACT

Due to the recent passing of House Bill 564, effective August 28, 1993 the following definition of Advanced Practice Nurse has been added to the Nurse Practice Act under 335.016 - it is to be entered as a new number (2), thereby renumbering existing 2 through 9 to 3 through 10:

- (2) "Advanced Practice Nurse", a nurse who has had education beyond the basic nursing education and is certified by a nationally recognized professional organization as having a nursing specialty, or who meets criteria for advanced practice nurses established by the Board of Nursing. The Board of Nursing may promulgate rules specifying which professional nursing organization certifications are to be recognized as advanced practice nurses, and may set standards for education, training and experience required for those without such specialty certification to become advanced practice nurses;

BECOMING AN NCLEX PANEL MEMBER

By participating in the NCLEX development process, you will have

the opportunity to learn how the nursing licensure examinations are developed from job analysis through results reporting. In addition, you will have the personal satisfaction of knowing that you had input into the process through item writing, item reviewing, recommending a passing standard or serving on the Bias Sensitivity Review Panel.

Without participation by nurses like yourself, National Council would not be able to develop licensure examinations. Stop wondering what the NCLEX is all about and apply for one of the panels. The process is very simple, and applications are available from the Board office or the National Council. The National Council will notify you about eight weeks before the session if you have been selected to participate. Pack your bags and start discovering.

ITEM WRITERS (selected annually)

Item Writers develop the multiple-choice questions that are used for the NCLEX. Qualifications include:

1. Be currently licensed and recommended by the Board of Nursing in the jurisdiction where you practice.
2. Be a registered nurse (RN) with a master's or higher degree in nursing (for NCLEX-RN) or be a licensed practical nurse (LPN/LVN) or RN (for NCLEX-PN).
3. Be responsible for teaching basic/undergraduate students in the clinical area or be currently employed in clinical nursing practice.
4. Have knowledge of the scope of entry-level nursing practice.

PANEL OF JUDGES (selected every three years; RN: 1992; PN: 1993)

The Panel of Judges recommends the NCLEX passing score to the National Council Board of Directors. Qualifications include:

1. Be currently licensed and recommended by the Board of

Nursing in the jurisdiction where you practice.

2. Be an RN (for NCLEX-RN) or an LPN/LVN or RN (for NCLEX-PN).
3. Be currently employed in clinical nursing practice giving patient care AND work directly with nurses who have entered nursing practice during the past twelve months. One basic/undergraduate faculty member will be on the panel, as well as a nurse licensed within the past year.

ITEM REVIEWERS
(selected annually)

Item Reviewers review the items that are created by the item writers. Qualifications include:

1. Be currently licensed and recommended by the Board of Nursing in the jurisdiction where you practice.
2. Be an RN (for NCLEX-RN) or an LPN/LVN or RN (for NCLEX-PN).
3. Be currently employed in clinical nursing practice giving patient care AND work directly with nurses who have entered nursing practice during the past twelve months.

BIAS SENSITIVITY
REVIEW PANEL (BSRP)
(selected every two years, in even-numbered years)

The BSRP reviews NCLEX items for racial bias and culturally-bound material. Qualifications include:

1. Be currently licensed in the jurisdiction where you practice.
2. Be an RN, LPN/LVN or a linguist.
3. Speak and understand more than one language (does not apply to the linguist, male or African-American member).
4. Be assimilated into American culture, but have affiliations

with original culture of your ethnic group (does not apply to linguist or male member).

5. Have ability to empathize with persons of various socio-economic status and be sensitive to class and lifestyle difference.

All meetings will occur one time for three to five days in a convenient location (except BSRP which will require attendance quarterly for two years).

All expenses are paid by the National Council or its test service.

Continuing education units are provided to item writers and item reviewers.

The deletion of Humanities from curriculum mandates in Minimum Standards for Accredited Programs of Professional Nursing became official September 9, 1993. This is not to imply that the Board of Nursing does not value the inclusion of humanities in nursing curriculum but only that they believe that the degree granting institution should mandate general education courses necessary for the degree.

C.A.T. IMPLEMENTATION SEMINAR
October 26, 1993

In April, 1994, NCLEX is scheduled to change from the standard paper-and-pencil, twice-a-year administration to year-round testing via computerized adaptive testing (CAT). This change will occur in all jurisdictions at the same time for

both the NCLEX-RN and NCLEX-PN. The purpose of this seminar is to prepare Missouri for this change.

MEMORANDUM

RE: Statement on Advanced Practice Nursing

As you may already be aware, House Bill 564 passed in both the House and Senate during this year's legislative session and was signed by Governor Mel Carnahan on July 1, 1993. Signed bills became law August 28, 1993. You may contact the Missouri House Post Office at (314) 751-4555 to request a copy of House Bill 564.

A portion of House Bill 564 relates to physicians entering "into collaborative practice arrangements with registered professional nurses" (334.104.1.[State of Missouri Healing Arts Practice Act], p. 52) and with registered professional nurses who are advanced practice nurses (334.104.2.[State Missouri Healing Arts Practice Act], p. 53). The bill, furthermore, established a definition of "advanced practice nurse" (335.016.[2], p.57) in Missouri's Nursing Practice Act.

"Advanced practice nurse", a nurse who has had education beyond the basic nursing education and is certified by a nationally recognized professional organization as having a nursing specialty, or who meets criteria for advanced practice nurses established by the board of nursing. The board of nursing may promulgate rules specifying which professional nursing organization certifications are to be recognized as advanced practice nurses, and may set standards for education, training and experience required for those without such specialty certification to become advanced practice nurses.

At this time, all professional nurses (RNs) practice under the same license in Missouri.

In light of House Bill 564 being signed into law, the Missouri State Board of Nursing has issued a "Statement on Advanced Practice Nursing" (9-30-93) which you will find attached along with a copy of the Nurse Specialty Titles Rule (4CSR200-4.100).

The Board of Nursing would like to remind you that, pursuant to House Bill 564, rulemaking is not a prerequisite to collaborative practice arrangements being enacted between physicians and registered professional nurses. Advanced practice nurses, therefore, are encouraged to establish and/or continue in collaborative practice arrangements. Furthermore, nothing in the attached "Statement on Advanced Practice Nursing" precludes other registered professional nurses from engaging in collaborative practice arrangements as specified in House Bill 564.

Please distribute copies of this memorandum, "Statement on Advanced Practice Nursing", and Nurse Specialty Titles Rule to other health care colleagues as needed.

MISSOURI STATE BOARD OF NURSING
STATEMENT ON
ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSING

The Missouri State Board of Nursing widely disseminate a statement that Registered nurses entering into collaborative practice arrangements with physicians including prescriptions be nationally certified in an advanced practice role consistent with the Nurse Specialty Titles Rule (4 CSR 200-4.100). The advanced practice nurses who are so certified be advised forthwith to

- 1) develop written agreements with their collaborating physician and place them on file in their collaborative practice and
- 2) append documents verifying their current certification to this on-file agreement.

The Missouri State Board of Nursing Practice Committee move forthwith to offer a plan of action that addresses the elements of HB564 concerning additional criteria for determining the recognition of Advanced Practice Nurses who are not nationally certified as consistent with the Nurse Specialty Titles Rule (4 CSR 200-4.100). The Practice Committee be empowered to establish Task Force(s) if it so chooses.

The additional criteria will be available for Board approval by the January, 1994 Board meeting.

TITLE 4 - DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
DIVISION 200 - STATE BOARD OF NURSING, CHAPTER 4 - GENERAL RULES

4 CSR 200-4.100 - NURSE SPECIALTY TITLES

PURPOSE: This rule specifies the qualifications necessary for a nurse to use certain specialty titles and protects the public from misrepresentation concerning the nursing profession.

- (1) No nurse shall use the following titles or abbreviations of those titles unless they meet the criteria stated:
 - (A) Certified registered nurse anesthetist - must be a registered nurse and hold current certification by the national certifying body of the American Association of Nurse Anesthetists;
 - (B) Certified nurse midwives - must be a registered nurse and hold current certification by the national certifying body of the American College of Nurse Midwives;
 - (C) Certified nurse practitioner - must be a registered nurse and hold current certification in the area of nursing specialty practice by the national certifying body of -
 1. The Organization for Obstetric, Gynecologic and Neonatal Nurse (NAACOG) Certification Corporation as an obstetrician/gynecologist (OB/GYN) nurse practitioner or neonatal nurse practitioner;
 2. The American Nurses Association as a family nurse practitioner, or adult nurse practitioner, or gerontological nurse practitioner; or
 3. The National Certification Board of Pediatric Nurse Practitioners and Nurses as a pediatric nurse practitioner; and
 - (D) Clinical nurse specialist - must be a registered nurse and have a master's degree in the area of clinical nursing specialty practice or be currently certified by the American Nurses Association as a clinical nurse specialist in the area of specialty practice.
- (2) Use of the title certified registered nurse anesthetist, certified nurse midwife, certified nurse practitioner or clinical nurse specialist without meeting the requirements set forth in section (1) is a misrepresentation in the performance of the functions or duties of a licensed professional or practical nurse and is grounds for discipline under section 335.066.2(5), RSMo.
