PHILOSOPHY FROM FLO

The Missouri General Assembly is once again in session, and once again there are many difficult pieces of legislation that are being debated. The Board of Nursing has several bills that are waiting and are as follows:

1. House Bill 1082 - changes to the Nursing Practice Act. In order for Missouri to change cleanly and clearly to C.A.T. (Computerized Adaptive Testing) some small changes in wording must be made. It is imperative these changes become effective in 1994. The Board of Nursing would also like to be able to renew licenses less frequently than every year without reducing the amount of surcharge collected by the Board for the Nursing Student Loan and Repayment Program administered by the Department of Health.

The definition of professional nursing includes the statement that nurses administer treatment and medications as prescribed by someone licensed in this state to prescribe treatment and medication. Nurses sometimes need to be able to follow the directions of a physician licensed in another state but not necessarily in Missouri (i.e., nurses in home health may care for patients who are seeing physicians or have been to clinics several states away). That language needs changing to allow those patients access to care in the home.


There are also several places where wording needs to be changed to make the meaning more clear, more or less housekeeping or clean-up measures.

The Board will be involved in affecting several other pieces of legislation initiated by other groups or individuals whose stated aim is improving access to health care, such as language relative to nurse

midwifery (SB 779) and lay-midwifery (HB 985). The Board of Nursing is also interested in the proposed alternative to discipline or Peer Assistance language (HB 1032) being offered again this session. If you have an interest in following and/or influencing these pieces of legislation, please call for an update since any information written here could change momentarily as the session advances.

I encourage all to become involved. Contact your legislators on local, state, and national issues and take control of your future. One of the hallmarks of a mature professional is that of taking an interest in the good of the whole and working toward improvement for all. The mature professional has broadened vision and objectives that span much more than "me and mine" and "here and now". I'm anxious to see us become a mature profession. Now is the perfect time to assist in that process.

Let me hear from you! I will gladly provide information of any sort including phone numbers and addresses of Legislators. We can discuss strategies, lobbying efforts, or anything which may be of interest to you.

**Duke University Medical Center: 10
Years of Treatment for Smokers**

Deep in the heart of tobacco country is an innovative, long-standing program to help hospitalized patients break the nicotine habit. Ten years ago, the Smoker's Consultation Service (SCS) at Duke University Medical Center, Durham, NC, was the first in the nation to provide bedside smoking cessation counseling in the hospital setting.

Over 5,000 people, mostly cardiovascular patients, have participated in the program. The program also includes counseling services for patients experiencing nicotine withdrawal and for any patients receiving nicotine patches or gum.

NON-SUFFICIENT FUNDS CHECKS

When a nurse issues a check for licensure on an account with insufficient funds, for whatever reason, the license issued in good

faith becomes invalid immediately upon board office notification. The license then remains invalid until such time as it is paid for in full, which includes the renewal fee and penalty for NSF check. In matters concerning license renewal, when NSF checks are issued, the renewed license becomes null and void. This becomes a very serious matter in that the nurse is then considered, from a legal perspective, practicing on a lapsed license. The licensee, in these circumstances, should not practice nursing until the license is paid for in full; this includes the renewal fee, late fee since the deadline for renewal has passed and penalty for NSF check. Furthermore, if the licensee has worked on a lapsed license, addition disciplinary action may be taken.







FURTHER INFORMATION REGARDING RELEASES OF INFORMATION

In order for the Missouri State Board of Nursing to provide information

from a licensee's file which is not available -

- a. under the Mandatory Reporting Rule, or
- b. as a matter of public record,

a release bearing a signature of the licensee authorizing the Missouri State Board of Nursing to release information must be received. A release reflecting a copy of the signature is as sufficient as the original signature.

BOARD MEETING CANCELLED

REVISION MADE TO UNCOLLECTIBLE POLICY

At the January, 1994 Board meeting, a motion was made, seconded, and passed to revise the uncollectible policy from "30 days to 20 days" as the time frame that acceptable repayment for an uncollectible instrument must be received in our office after notification as been sent to the licensee.

In addition to the 20 day time frame, the decision of the Board was to also begin utilizing the Prosecuting Attorney's office for assistance in collecting uncollectible instruments that the Board of Nursing has been unsuccessful in recovering.

When notification of an uncollectible

instrument is received in this office, the licensee/applicant is sent a certified letter, return receipt requested. The letter states that repayment must be received within 20 days or the matter will be referred to the Prosecuting Attorney's office for further pursuit. The file of the licensee or applicant is flagged and verified as "invalid" until the uncollectible has been made good.

If a licensee/applicant has contacted our office in advance regarding a possible uncollectible instrument, the information is maintained in a flagged file. When we receive notification from the Department of Revenue of the uncollectible instrument, licensee's/applicants who have contacted us in advance receive a phone call and instructions on submitting acceptable repayment.

During the renewal period it can take from four (4) to six (6) weeks for our office to receive notice from the Department of Revenue that the payment will not clear the bank. Therefore, PLEASE DO NOT AUTOMATICALLY SEND A REPAYMENT when you receive notice from your bank, call our office first. We do not automatically accept a repayment for an uncollectible instrument without first receiving notice from the Department of Revenue that the payment was uncollectible. For us to do so would give the appearance that a duplicate payment is being made.

If the licensee/applicant fails to make restitution for the uncollectible instrument, their information will be referred to the Prosecuting Attorney's office, and their name and license number will be listed in the quarterly Newsletter published by this office.

GRADUATE EXEMPTED PRACTICE PERIOD & RELEASE OF INFORMATION

As most of you know, on April 1, 1994 the method of administering the National Council Licensure Examinations changed from the traditional paper-and-pencil method to computerized adaptive testing.

The change in testing necessitated a change in the rule for graduate exempted practice.

The graduate exempted practice period rule, 4 CSR 200-4.020 (3) reads: "A graduate of a nursing program may practice as a graduate nurse until s/he has received the results of the first licensure examination taken by the nurse or until ninety (90) days after graduation, whichever first occurs."

With the implementation of CAT, many employers of graduate nurses have been looking for ways to streamline their process of verifying graduate nurse status.

The only information that is public regarding an exam applicant is the applicant's name and address. If you would like the Board to verify any other information, the Board must have a signed Authorization to Release Confidential Information from the applicant. A sample release form is contained in this article.
