CHAIR'S LETTER

Changes Regarding Continuing Competency Credits

Two rule changes were recently approved which will impact how Continuing Competency Credits (CCC's) may be earned. First of all, online courses are now included in the same category as, "attending

workshops, seminars, lectures, professional conferences accepted by the certifying entity approved by the division". This means that there is no restriction on the number of CCC's that one may earn through online learning options. A practitioner may, if she or he chooses, earn all CCC's (at least 24 every two years) via online learning opportunities.

In accord with a second rule change practitioners may no longer carry over CCC's in excess of 24 from a previous renewal cycle into the current renewal cycle.

In April 2007 the Board will be sending out renewal forms, therefore, please be sure that this office has your current mailing address. Failure to receive the renewal notice does not relieve you of the obligation to renew and pay the required fee prior to June 30, 2007.

In addition, you will be required to attest on the renewal form as to whether or not you have completed the required twenty-four (24) continuing competency credits. For further information regarding the continuing competency requirements, please refer to 4 20 CSR 2205-5.010 Continuing Competency Requirements or visit the website at <http://pr.mo.gov/octherapy.asp>.

Please do not submit verification of having completed the continuing competency requirements unless you receive written notification from this office to do so.

I would like to take this opportunity to address the issue about what titles occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants licensed by the board can use.

If an occupational therapist is both registered by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT)[®] and licensed by the Missouri Board of Occupational Therapy, then they can use the title OTR/L. However, if the individual does not hold current registration with NBCOT[®] but holds a valid license with the Missouri Board of Occupational Therapy, then they can only use the title OT/L.


An occupational therapy assistant who is both certified by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT)[®] and licensed by the Missouri Board of Occupational Therapy can use the title COTA/L. However, if the individual does not hold a current certification with NBCOT[®] but holds a valid license with the Missouri Board of Occupational Therapy, they can only use the title OTA/L.

AOTA Annual Conference and Expo

Hospitality: Volunteers in this area will serve as resources to the St. Louis area. Some work for this committee will also occur prior to conference.



Any complaint that is received by the Board is acknowledged in writing. The complainant will be notified of the final outcome. Any disciplinary action taken by the Board is a matter of public record.
