## ARCHITECTURAL DIVISION LETTER

This is my first time writing an article for Dimensions; therefore, I would like to start off by introducing myself. I'm Ken Frashier, and I started my architectural career in 1959 at Kansas State University (KSU). I lived in Kansas City, Missouri through high school, and would have gone to architecture school in Missouri, but there wasn't one at that time. So, since Missouri had reciprocity with Kansas, I decided on KSU.

I worked in KCMO during the summers to get experience during college. I graduated in the summer of 1963, and established my home in Kansas City. I worked for several firms gaining a wide variety of experience for the next six years, until I made the leap to private practice in 1970. I took the licensing exam in Jefferson City in 1966 as soon as I was eligible, and miraculously passed the test the first time. I have been practicing architecture ever since in Kansas City, Overland Park, Lee's Summit, and now at Lake Lotawana in my home. I have worked on many different building types during my 40 years of architectural work, and I enjoyed every minute of it except for the recessions that seem to happen every 10 years or so.

The Missouri Board for Architects, Professional Engineers, Professional Land Surveyors and Landscape Architects is my newest adventure. I have been involved in AIA committees, planning commissions, homeowners associations, and am still chairman of the Lake Lotawana Board of Adjustments. When I saw a notice in the KCAIA newsletter that they were looking for someone interested in serving in a statewide capacity on the Missouri Board, I said yes, and that started a process that took almost nine months until I was appointed by Governor Nixon, and confirmed by the Missouri Senate.

The job is certainly more complex and interesting than I could have ever imagined. I've only attended two Board meetings so far, but I am already heavily involved with many other responsibilities such as meeting with members of the Pillar's Group from KCAIA and members of the Missouri AIA. There is a steady flow of correspondence from the Board of-

fice regarding ongoing cases involving architects licensed in Missouri who have had allegations lodged against them regarding a variety of infractions of state law. We also get involved with engineering cases, surveying cases, and landscape architectural cases and have had hearings with city building officials on their code enforcement. The Board has a very professional, experienced staff of ten full time employees and a couple of contract employees consisting of an investigator and attorney who provides general counsel to the Board. The Board utilizes representatives from the Attorney General's office for its litigation. I have also enjoyed meeting the other members of the Board. It is fun getting their views about practice and their locations around the state.

At the writing of my next article, I will know more about the way the Board functions and have a better grasp on my responsibilities. At that time I will be able to discuss the Board's concerns about the practice of architecture in Missouri. I do know that paying your Missouri taxes, keeping your license renewed, licensing your corporation to practice in Missouri, keeping up on continuing education requirements, and only signing and sealing drawings that are prepared within your area of expertise are all very important. The consequences of licensees failing to do these things are typically addressed in the regularly scheduled meetings of the Board and are some areas that will be discussed in detail in future articles.

## APELSLA, more than meets the eye

Since my appointment by Governor Nixon to the Missouri Board of APELSLA in November 2009, I have been very eager to learn about the Board's duties and how my role on the Board will help enhance the life of all members of the engineering profession and more importantly the lives of all Missourians. Like most engineers, my knowledge of the Board was limited to the approval of FE and PE exams, issuing of licenses and auditing of continuing education PDHs. For the vast majority of engineers, the interaction with the Board is typically in the aforementioned areas. Most are not aware of the other responsibilities of the Board.

From the Board's web page <http://pr.mo.gov/apelsla.asp>, you will find that the Missouri Board for Architects, Professional Engineers, Professional Land Surveyors and Landscape Architects was established in 1941 to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Missouri against the danger of collapse of structures erected for public use. The Board also exists to safeguard Missouri residents and their property from damages that might result from illegal and incompetent architectural, engineering, land surveying and landscape architectural practices.

These responsibilities seem straightforward until you get the opportunity to serve and realize that there is more than meets the eye. Behind closed doors, I have been able to witness how much work the Board does to keep us all safe, enforce the laws on the books, regulate who and what type of companies we allow to practice in the state, manage the standards for getting licensed, work with professional organizations, and to clarify the rules that are interpreted from one community to another. So far I have attended only two Board meetings but I have participated in a number of phone conferences, uncountable deliberations, and processed numerous applications for licenses either by exam or comity. I have also been involved in the review of over fifty disciplinary actions. One glaring perception offered by a board member of the engineers club of St. Louis where I also serve on the board is that the APELSLA Board has been quite active in addressing complaints against individuals and professionals not following the Code of State Regulations. These regulations along with the MO Revised Statutes (RSMo) guide the Board in addressing complaints. In particular, Chapter 327, RSMo. If you are reading this article, I strongly encourage you to read the statutes as it is the equivalent of the constitution and amendments for the practice of engineering in Missouri.

Several glaring issues that present challenges to this Board include how long it takes to resolve complaints. When a complaint is made, it goes through a prescribed process of review, investigations, filing of complaint by the Attorney General's office and in some cases, hearings and even law suits. This process can take as little as one month to as long as five years. It is essential to go through this process so that the complaint is given fair and judicious consideration.

An area of concern is the practice of engineering without a license or companies operating without a Certificate of Authority (COA) to practice. It is actually astounding the number of companies that have been practicing without a COA since their existence or the number of out of area companies that come into Missouri to provide professional service without obtaining the COA. Section 327.077.1 states that in the case of disciplinary actions against licensed or unlicensed persons, the Board may issue an order imposing a civil penalty. Such penalty shall not be imposed until the findings of fact and conclusions of law by the Administrative Hearing Commission have been delivered to the Board in accordance with section 621.110, RSMo. Further, no civil penalty shall commence until a formal meeting and vote by the Board has been taken to impose such a penalty. This statute goes to the first issue of why it takes a long time to adjudicate complaints.

Another issue that confronts the Board is the lack of consistent standards from one municipality to another on what the requirements are for getting plans approved for construction. A significant amount of Missouri municipalities do not have ordinances that specify the requirements for engineering or architectural plans prior to approval and permits. The Board then finds itself in the middle of a conflict between enforcing the statutes and the municipal standard practice that conflict with the statute. This presents a set of challenges as the Board has no jurisdictional authority over certain municipalities.

The Board is also charged with working with the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES) in establishing testing standards that can be uniformly applied across the country thereby allowing for comity of licenses between states. In the course of carrying out this duty, the Board has to give strong consideration to fees paid for testing and maintaining

professional registration.

This Board's objective is to create an environment where engineers can concentrate their efforts on building and improving the state of Missouri. To achieve these objectives, the Board is embarking on adopting a strategic plan that will focus on four general categories code named a "MAPP for the Future."

**Maintaining Financial Stability and Oversight**

**Achieving Excellence in Organization and Operations**

**Protecting the Public**

**Pursuing Educational Outreach and Dialogue with Stakeholders**

This takes a lot of hard work, communication, dedication, commitment and time. I look forward to serving my fellow citizens and am excited about facing even more challenges over my term of office.

## PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYING DIVISION LETTER

Appointment to the Registration Board has been a humbling experience for me. Although I have known several Board Members over my career, I had only a vague idea of the issues they faced or the amount of time they contributed to execute their duties as Board Members. I want to express my gratitude to former Board Members Jim Anderson, Mike Gray and John Teale for their mentoring and leading me through the maze of bureaucracy. The one thing that all Board Members have in common is their dedication to the 'Mission' of protecting the public from

incompetency, misconduct, gross negligence, fraud, misrepresentation and/or dishonesty.

The most common stereotype image of "the Board" is similar to that of being sent to the principal's office but that is just a small part of our duties. When an individual seeks to become a Professional Land Surveyor he/she goes through an administrative process completing an application, securing letters of recommendation, listing surveying education and experience. The Board staff does an outstanding job verifying the technical aspects of the application but we are the ones who evaluate these applicants. The Board Members review these applications with the goal of licensing only "qualified" professionals. Section 327.312 RSMo provides the "steps" to licensure. The vast majority of the individuals who begin the licensing process have the minimal educational requirements of "12 semester hours of approved surveying course work." We evaluate transcripts for duplication...if we're doing our job we won't approve 6 hours for two (2) courses if the courses are basically the same, i.e. "principles of surveying" at one institution and "fundamentals of surveying" at another school. We also look at the types of courses. Cartography is a good course but it is not an acceptable substitute for a course in "advanced surveying" or "surveying II". There is a required "body of knowledge" that is necessary to be a successful surveyor and there are no shortcuts.

Another area we look at is work experience. Board Rule 20 CSR 2030-5.110 defines professional office and field experience. The applicants must have at least 1/3 of their experience in the field and 1/3 in the office, all under the direct personal supervision of a licensed Professional Land Surveyor. Engineering surveying can be counted but will receive no more than 25% credit. As an example, the LS candidate lists 6 months in the office, 18 months in the field and 24 months of engineering surveys. Even

though he has 4 years experience he has not yet met the experience requirement because (1) we count only 25% of the 24 months of engineering surveys; and, (2) even if the engineering surveys were boundary surveying, he still isn't qualified because he must have at least 1/3 or 16 months of office experience. The supervising PLS, properly mentoring his workers, will make sure these individuals receive the required experience. When we see experience forms signed off by a PLS that do not meet the requirements we see a licensee who is negligent in his supervision.

In fulfilling our mission to protect the public we are responsible for policing our profession. The most distasteful part of this job is discipline. In 2007 when I first joined the Board I anticipated that we would review complaints and dispense discipline as needed. I was amazed to find that we were working on complaints that dated back over 2 years. The cases are not black or white but many shades of gray. The process is slow and tedious. When a surveying complaint is filed we review the complaint and request a response. The information is evaluated by the Survey Division at the next quarterly meeting. If we determine that further investigation is warranted, our investigator will gather additional evidence. Occasionally we will also conduct a field investigation, this process often takes 3-6 months. We then may request an appearance by the surveyor to allow him or her a chance to answer the charges and explain his or her position. The case can then be closed or forwarded to the Administrative Hearing Commission (AHC), a process that generally takes about 6-12 months. Finally, if the AHC deems the evidence sufficient and rules accordingly, we then conduct a disciplinary hearing. Discipline can range in severity from a letter of censure to probation, suspension or revocation. In addition, monetary civil penalties can be assessed up to \$5,000 for each offense or day of a continued violation with a maximum penalty of \$25,000.

## LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURAL DIVISION LETTER

Recently I had the privilege of serving as the Chair of the Board's Strategic Planning Committee. In my time on the Board I believe we have done an outstanding job of managing the day in and day out affairs of Board business, however long term visioning may have been lacking. We are concerned that "we have always done it that way" may not be the best answer to serve both our licensee's and the citizens of Missouri. The Board voted to create a committee made up of the Board Chair and one member from each division to work towards creating the first strategic plan.

Most of us have participated in the strategic planning process in our work place, and thought it might be beneficial to have the assistance of a management/business consultant to assist us in the preparation of a strategic plan. We selected Art Davis, President of the Art Davis Group, to serve as our facilitator. The process began in January with an anonymous survey of the Board Members, recent Board Members, and staff. Key questions asked included: What are the three most important short-term and long term issues facing APELSLA? What does the APELSLA do well? What existing programs and initiatives could APELSLA improve? What is APELSLA not doing that it should be doing? And what is APELSLA doing that it should not be doing? Art collected and compiled the responses and gave a presentation to the full Board at the January meeting.

About the same time, the four professional societies through the Design Alliance were identified as key stakeholders in the planning process and

were also surveyed. Likewise these survey results were compiled, and a work session with the Design Alliance, Board Strategic Planning Committee and the consultant, was held in early March to review the results. Remarkably, there were common themes identified by both the Board and the Design Alliance.

The final stakeholders selected for input were the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration Director John Huff, and Professional Registration Division Director Jane Rackers. In March, Mr. Davis and I met with them to solicit their input on the development of the strategic plan. They were supportive of the strategic plan concept and gave valuable guidance from the department and division perspectives.

Key components of the Strategic Plan include a new mission statement and four primary strategic initiatives. They are:

- The Mission Statement has been shortened "To protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Missouri through the regulation of the practice of architecture, engineering, land surveying, and landscape architecture."
- Maintaining Financial Stability and Oversight
- Achieving Excellence in Organization and Operations
- Protecting the Public
- Pursuing Educational Outreach and Dialogue with Stakeholders

As Art pointed out, the acronym of the four initiatives is MAPP, our road map for the future.

The strategic plan was presented to the full Board in May and the Board approved and adopted the plan. Responsibilities for various components have been assigned to Board Members and staff. Reports on the progress for the various initiatives will be presented to the full Board at each quarterly meeting. This will ensure that the Strategic Plan remains a relevant document in the near future. If you are interested in reviewing the full Strategic Plan, please

## INCIDENTAL PRACTICE

At the Design Alliance Meeting on March 4, 2010, in Jefferson City one of the agenda items was "Incidental Practice Clarifications." Discussing this issue is like bringing up the fact that a 300 pound gorilla is in the room, but no one wants to talk about it. Maybe it is time we did talk about it. Why is this such an off limits topic? Is it because in years past, architects and engineers did not trust each other? Through collaborative efforts like the Design Alliance, we are closer now to working out our professional differences than ever before.

One participant at the meeting compared defining incidental practice to what US Supreme Court Justice Byron White once said about pornography, he could not define it, but knew it when he saw it. Do we really know incidental practice when we see it?

Missouri statutes are a little vague on the subject. Persons excepted from the unauthorized practice of engineering in Section 327.191(4) includes "Any holder of a currently valid license or certificate of authority as an architect who performs only such engineering work as is incidental and necessary to the completion of architectural work lawfully being performed by such architect." Similarly, persons excepted from the unauthorized practice of architecture in Section 327.101(3) includes "Any holder of a currently valid license as a professional engineer who performs only such architectural work as is incidental and necessary to the completion of engineering work lawfully being performed by such licensed professional engineer." Section 327.101(5) goes further by listing currently used exceptions to the practice of architecture for privately owned buildings, including:

- a) A dwelling house
- b) Two family dwelling house
- c) Commercial or industrial building with an occupancy of not more than 9 people
- d) Structure less than 20,000 cubic feet, except as described in b) and c), and
- e) Farm building

I researched the laws of several states and Canada. New Mexico places a dollar limit on the project, such that "Architectural work incidental to engineering shall be that architectural work provided on projects with a building construction value not greater than four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) and having a total occupant load not greater than fifty (50)." Engineering work incidental to architecture has the same limits, \$400,000 and fifty (50) occupants. There is also a general height limit of two (2) stories.

Utah defines incidental practice to be "work on a project with a construction value not greater than 15 percent of the overall construction value of a project including all changes or additions to the contracted or agreed upon work."

Arkansas has maybe the best answer to the question of what constitutes incidental practice. The Arkansas Board of Registration of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors and the Arkansas State Board of Architects jointly adopted a resolution concerning the respective practices of Architecture and Engineering. In part, the resolution states the following:

1. The Arkansas Engineering and Architectural Acts classify buildings according to their intended purpose:

A. The design of buildings intended for accommodation of equipment, vehicles, goods and/or processes or other utilitarian functions, with human occupancy including office spaces as required for the support of these functions constitutes the Practice of Engineering (A.C.A. 17-30-104).

B. The design and construction of buildings for human occupancy or habitation constitutes the Practice of Architecture (A.C.A. 17-15-102)

2. Incidental practice means the performance of any service or design which is a small part of a larger project and is simple in design or minor in cost and for which the practitioner is qualified.
3. Design professionals performing incidental service or design must be prepared to:
  - A. Demonstrate qualifications and competency in the area of incidental practice.
  - B. Demonstrate that the life, health, property and welfare of the public are not compromised by performance of the incidental design.
  - C. Accept full responsibility for the incidental design or service.

The Missouri Board for Architects, Professional Engineers, Professional Land Surveyors and Landscape Architects (Board) interprets the statutes and rules on an individual complaint basis, meaning each complaint is reviewed independently and applicable statutes and rules are researched and applied as deemed appropriate. Each division reviews the complaints falling within their area of expertise, and outside experts are consulted when necessary. The next step is full Board action on each individual complaint.

In areas where the accused claims the work in question is incidental practice, the Board does not try to define what work is incidental. Instead the Board looks to see if the work was done in a competent manner, does it meet the necessary standard of care for engineering and architecture. Board Rule 20 CSR 2030-2.010 (4) states "Licensees shall undertake to perform architecture, professional engineering, land surveying, and landscape architecture services only when they are qualified by education, training, and experience in the specific technical areas involved."

Because we don't license engineers by discipline, each licensee must make the decision as to whether or not he/she is qualified to perform the design required. If a complaint is made and they are found not to be competent in an area of design, they face discipline, which could be anything from a reprimand to revocation of their license, depending upon the offense. Architects are looked at the same way, are they qualified by education, training, and experience to perform the design.

So what should we do? Is it time to develop a stricter definition of incidental practice? Is it time to develop a memorandum of understanding or a resolution between architects and engineers? Is it time to become more discipline specific in our licensing process? Or do we continue to interpret the statutes and rules as we do now? ## **CLARIFICATION ON "WHO CAN WRITE A LEGAL DESCRIPTION"**

Over the past few months following the distribution of our Winter 2009 Dimensions newsletter we've had a number of inquiries pertaining to the article entitled "Who can write a legal description?" It is not an easy question to answer. The statute is clear that ONLY licensed surveyors can determine the location of land boundary lines. What is not clear and what has been questioned is does an easement fall within the definition of land surveying, and if it does, are there any exceptions to the general requirement that land surveys be prepared by licensed land surveyors. There is no question that an easement is a recordable interest in real property and that it does affect some real property rights. However, do all easements affect the location of land boundary lines to the extent that only land surveyors can prepare them?

Some land surveyors when reading section 327.272 (2) of the statute appear to quit reading before they get to the last 9 words... "as it affects the location of land boundary lines." An easement creates servitude but does it actually affect the land boundary lines? Many land surveyors and many non land surveyors conclude that the external boundary of the surveyed property does not change because of the easement. In fact, most land surveyors do not show easements unless specifically requested to do so or they are physically observed on the survey site. Such easements must be recorded to protect the title holders of those easements and are identified during property transfers.

Because of questions raised about whether easements tied to and running along a property boundary can be written by someone other than a land surveyor, and due to some disagreements within our professions regarding precisely what the statute is intended to provide, the Board will continue to consider whether such authority to prepare surveys for easements is a power reserved exclusively to the land surveyor. The Board does, however, reiterate that blanket easements prepared by entities with condemning authority are not enforceable and urges its licensees to work with such entities to eliminate that practice.

**DISCLAIMER:** Every effort has been made to ensure that the following enforcement information is correct. However, this information should not be relied upon without verification from the Board office. It should be noted that the names of companies and individuals listed may be similar to the names of the parties who have not had enforcement actions taken against them. Discipline orders are public data and copies may be obtained by contacting the Board office. Pursuant to Chapter 327, RSMo, a licensee is entitled to engage in the practice of architecture, engineering, land surveying or landscape architecture during his/her probationary period providing that the licensee adheres to all of the terms and conditions of the Order. However, a licensee whose license has been suspended, is not entitled to engage in the practice of architecture, engineering, land surveying or landscape architecture during his/her suspension period.

### LICENSES CURRENTLY ON SUSPENSION

**LANGERAK, JON W., E-25134** (St. Louis, Missouri) – suspension commenced on November 7, 2009 and ends on November 6, 2010 followed by three (3) years probation commencing on November 7, 2010 and ending on November 6, 2013.

Martinez, an agent of the City of Tulsa, intending to influence and reward Mr. Martinez in connection with awarding an engineering inspection service contract and a series of contracts involving \$5,000 or more with the City of Tulsa to FBS Engineers, Inc. and FBS, Inc. On September 3, 2009, the United States Magistrate entered an order finding that Mr. Shoemaker's plea was made freely, voluntarily, and because he was guilty as charged, and accepting and entering Mr. Shoemaker's plea of guilty.

On April 30, 2010, the Board received Mr. Nelson's supporting documentation for the required 30 PDHs and on May 3, 2010, the Board approved Mr. Nelson's hours.

**VIOLATION OF DISCIPLINE**

**KLITZING WELSCH ASSOCIATES, INC., A-2009024038**

**Cause for Discipline:** Cause exists to discipline Mr. Kliethermes' professional land surveyor's license pursuant to Section 327.441.2(5) by incompetency, misconduct, gross negligence, fraud, misrepresentation or dishonesty in the performance of the functions or duties of any profession licensed or regulated by this chapter; Section 327.441.2(6) by violation of, or assisting or enabling any person to violate, any provision of this chapter, or of any lawful rule or regulation adopted pursuant to this chapter; and, Section 327.441.2(13) by violation of any professional trust or confidence.

**Board Action:** The Board authorized the Attorney General's Office to proceed with settlement. Thereafter on March 8, 2010, Mr. Kliethermes entered into an agreement with the Board, agreeing to his professional land surveying license, number LS-2159, being censured.

**CHANDER P. NANGIA, E-16817**

Houston, Texas

**Summary:** On February 22, 2007, Mr. Nangia surrendered his professional engineering license in the state of Alaska in order to resolve a matter, which involved allegations that Mr. Nangia did not report licensing actions in other jurisdictions when renewing his Alaska license, and that he sealed and signed documents for which he did not have direct professional knowledge or direct supervisory control.

**UNLICENSED PRACTICE:**

As you can see in 2009 the Board had 37 complaints filed against individuals and 49 complaints filed against corporations which were charged with practicing architecture, professional engineering, professional land surveying and/or landscape architecture without being properly licensed. If an individual or corporation refuses to voluntarily cease and desist all illegal activities and to conduct all future activities in compliance with Chapter 327, then the Board can request the Attorney General's office to file suit in the appropriate circuit court seeking an injunction to restrain that individual or corporation from practicing architecture, professional engineering, professional land surveying and/or landscape architecture without a license. Another option the Board has is to refer the matter to the Attorney General's Office to seek authority to assess a civil penalty. A civil penalty imposed under Section 327.077 can be as high as \$5,000 for each offense. However, each day of a continued violation constitutes a separate offense, with a maximum penalty of \$25,000. The Board assessed 16 civil penalties in 2009.
