**ORDER OF THE MISSOURI STATE BOARD OF COSMETOLOGY
AND BARBER EXAMINERS ISSUING A PROBATIONARY
BARBER STUDENT LICENSE TO DeSHANNON D. TURNER**

The Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners (the "Board") hereby issues its **ORDER** granting a **PROBATIONARY BARBER STUDENT LICENSE**, License No. 2019013866 to DeShannon D. Turner ("Applicant"), pursuant to the provisions of § 324.038, RSMo.¹ As set forth in § 324.038.2, RSMo, Applicant may submit a written request to the Administrative Hearing Commission seeking a hearing and review of the Board's decision to issue a probated student license. Such written request must be filed with the Administrative Hearing Commission within 30 days of delivery or mailing of this Order of the Board. The written request should be addressed to the Administrative Hearing Commission, P.O. Box 1557, United States Post Office Building, Third Floor, 131 West High Street, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102. If no written request for review is filed with the Administrative Hearing Commission within the 30-day period, the right to seek review of the Board's decision shall be considered waived. Should Applicant file a written request for review of this Order, the terms and conditions of this Order shall remain in force and effect unless and/or until such time as the Administrative Hearing Commission issues an Order to the contrary.

Based upon the foregoing, the Board hereby states:

I.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board is an agency of the state of Missouri created and established pursuant to § 329.015, RSMo, for the purpose of licensing all persons engaged in the practice of barbering and

cosmetology in this state. The Board has control and supervision of the licensed occupations and enforcement of the terms and provisions of Chapters 328 and 329, RSMo.

2. On or about April 11, 2019, Applicant applied for a Missouri barber student license to enroll at Transformed Barber & Cosmetology Academy, LLC, 1229 E. 63rd Street, Kansas City, Missouri 64110.

3. On Applicant's application, Applicant answered "yes" to the question "Have you been adjudicated and found guilty, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, in a criminal prosecution in this state, or any or of the United States, whether or not sentence was imposed?"

4. In conjunction with his April 11, 2019 application, Applicant provided a written statement regarding his criminal record.

5. A review of Applicant's Missouri criminal history reveals that:

a. On or about June 18, 1999, Applicant pled guilty to the class A misdemeanor charge of *Resisting/Interfering With Arrest, Detention Or Stop*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri, case number 13R019964584. The Court sentenced Applicant to thirty-(30) days' jail incarceration.

b. On or about March 10, 2000, Applicant pled guilty to two class A misdemeanor charges of *Unlawful Use Of Drug Paraphernalia* and *Possession Of Up To 35 Grams Marijuana*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri, case number 13R019965597. The Court sentenced Applicant to forty-(40) days' jail incarceration for each charge.

c. On or about August 17, 2001, Applicant pled guilty to the class B misdemeanor charge of *Peace Disturbance, First Offense*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri, case number 01CR164655. The Court sentenced Applicant to forty-five-(45) days' jail incarceration. The Court suspended execution of Applicant's sentence and placed Applicant on two-(2) years' unsupervised probation.

d. On or about December 17, 2001, Applicant pled guilty to the class C felony charge of *Possession Of Controlled Substance Except 35 Grams Or Less Of Marijuana*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri, case number 01CR168763-01. The Court sentenced Applicant to three-(3) years' incarceration with the Missouri Department of Corrections. The Court suspended execution of Applicant's sentence and

placed Applicant on five-(5) years; supervised probation. Applicant's probation was subsequently revoked and the sentence of three-(3) years' incarceration with the Missouri Department of Corrections was ordered to be executed.

e. On or about May 3, 2003, Applicant pled guilty to the class B felony charge of *Trafficking In Drugs In The Second Degree*, in the Circuit Court of Boone County, Missouri, case number 02CR166241-01. The Court sentenced Applicant to eight-(8) years' incarceration with the Missouri Department of Corrections. The Court suspended execution of Applicant's sentence and placed Applicant on five-(5) years; supervised probation. Applicant's probation was subsequently revoked and the sentence of eight-(8) years' incarceration with the Missouri Department of Corrections was ordered to be executed.

f. On or about January 14, 2008, Applicant pled guilty to three class C felony charge of *Possession Of Controlled Substance Except 35 Grams Or Less Of Marijuana*, in the Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, case number 0516-CR06913-01. The Court sentenced Applicant to four-(4) years' incarceration with the Missouri Department of Corrections on each charge.

g. On or about June 3, 2008, Applicant pled guilty to the class C felony charge of *Possession Of Controlled Substance Except 35 Grams Or Less Of Marijuana* and the class A misdemeanor charge of *Possession Of Up To Except 35 Grams Of Marijuana* in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri, case number 07AC-CR01700-01. The Court sentenced Applicant to three-(3) years' incarceration with the Missouri Department of Corrections on the felony charge and one-(1) year on the misdemeanor charge to run concurrently.

h. On or about April 23, 2012, Applicant pled guilty to the class B felony charge of *Trafficking In Drugs In The Second Degree* and to two class C felony charges of *Possession Of Up To Except 35 Grams Of Marijuana* in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri, case number 11BA-CR04822-01. The Court sentenced Applicant to fifteen-(15) years' incarceration with the Missouri Department of Corrections on each charge. The Court recommended Applicant to a long-term treatment program and suspended execution of the incarceration sentencing. Applicant was placed on five-(5) years' supervised probation.

i. On or about November 30, 2017, Applicant pled guilty to the federal 18 U.S.C. section 922(g)(1) violation charge of *Felon in Possession of a Firearm* in the United States District Court For The Western District Of Missouri, Central Division, case number 15-04065-01CR-C-SRB. The Court sentenced Applicant to forty-eight-(48) months' incarceration with the Federal Bureau of Prisons. The Court ordered a three-(3) year period of supervised release.

II.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

6. The Board has authority to deny or refuse a license application pursuant to § 328.150.1, RSMo, which provides:

The board may refuse to issue any certificate of registration or authority, permit or license required pursuant to this chapter for one or any combination of causes stated in subsection 2 of this section. The board shall notify the applicant in writing of the reasons for the refusal and shall advise the applicant of his right to file a complaint with the administrative hearing commission as provided by chapter 621, RSMo.

7. The Board has cause to deny or refuse Applicant's application for a barber student license pursuant to § 328.150.2, RSMo, which provides:

The board may cause a complaint to be filed with the administrative hearing commission as provided by chapter 621, RSMo, against any holder of any certificate of registration or authority, permit or license required by this chapter or any person who has failed to renew or has surrendered the person's certificate of registration or authority, permit or license for any one or any combination of the following causes:

...

(2) The person has been finally adjudicated and found guilty, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, in a criminal prosecution under the laws of any state or of the United States, for any offense reasonably related to the qualifications, functions or duties of any profession licensed or regulated under this chapter, for any offense an essential element of which is fraud, dishonesty or an act of violence, or for any offense involving moral turpitude, whether or not sentence is imposed[.]

8. As a result of Applicant's criminal record as detailed in paragraph 5, the Board has cause to deny or refuse Applicant's application for a barber student license pursuant to § 328.150.1, RSMo, § 328.150.1, RSMo, and § 328.150.2(2), RSMo.

9. As an alternative to refusing to issue a license, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a license subject to probation, pursuant to § 324.038, RSMo, which provides:

Whenever a board within or assigned to the division of professional registration, including the division itself when so empowered, may refuse to issue a license for reasons which also serve as a basis for filing a complaint with the administrative hearing commission seeking disciplinary action against a holder of a license, the board, as an alternative to refusing to issue a license, may, at its discretion, issue to an applicant a license subject to probation.

10. The Board issues this Order in lieu of denial of Applicant's application for a barber student license. The Board has determined that this Order is necessary to ensure the protection of the public.

III.

ORDER

11. Based on the foregoing, Applicant, DeShannon D. Turner, is granted a barber **student license**, which is hereby placed on **PROBATION** for the period during which Applicant is enrolled in barber school and receiving training hours. During the aforementioned probation, DeShannon D. Turner shall be entitled to enroll as a barber student subject to the following terms and conditions.

IV.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

12. During the aforementioned probation, DeShannon D. Turner, shall be entitled to enroll as a barber student subject to the following terms and conditions:

- A. During the disciplinary period, Applicant shall comply with all provisions of Chapter 328, RSMo, all applicable board regulations, all applicable federal and state drug laws, rules and regulations and all applicable federal and state criminal laws. "State" includes the state of Missouri, all other states and territories of the United States, and the ordinances of their political subdivisions.
- B. During the disciplinary period, Applicant shall keep the Board informed of Applicant's current work and home telephone numbers. Applicant shall notify the Board in writing within ten days (10) of any change in this information.
- C. During the probationary period, Applicant shall accept and comply with unannounced visits from the Board's representatives to monitor compliance with the terms and conditions of this Order.
- D. During the disciplinary period, Applicant shall appear in person for interviews with the Board or its designee upon request.

- E. If, at any time during the probationary period, Applicant changes Applicant's address from the state of Missouri, or ceases to maintain Applicant's student license current or active under the provisions of Chapter 328, RSMo, or fails to keep the Board advised of all current places of residence, the time of such absence, unlicensed or inactive status, or unknown whereabouts shall not be deemed or taken to satisfy any part of the probationary period.
- F. The Board retains jurisdiction to hold a hearing at any time to determine if a violation of this Order has occurred and, if a violation of this Order has occurred, may seek to amend this Order or impose further disciplinary or appropriate action at the discretion of the Board. No order shall be entered by the Board pursuant to this paragraph without any required notice and opportunity for a hearing before the Board as provided by Chapter 536, RSMo.
- G. Unless otherwise specified by the Board, all reports, documentation, notices, or other materials required to be submitted to the Board shall be forwarded to: Missouri State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners, P.O. Box 1062, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- H. Any failure by Applicant to comply with any condition of discipline set forth herein constitutes a violation of this Order.

13. This Order does not bind the Board or restrict the remedies available to it concerning any violation by Applicant of the terms and conditions of this Order, Chapter 328, RSMo, or the regulations promulgated thereunder.

14. The Board will maintain this Order as an open, public record of the Board as provided in Chapters 328, 329, 610 and 324, RSMo.
