CHALLENGES TO THE GEOLOGIST REGISTRATION ACT

The Geologist Registration Act will be 20 years old next year. The original bill sponsored by Senators Jerry Howard and Mike Lybyer passed nearly

unanimously in both houses and was signed by the late Governor Mel Carnahan. Major contributors to the effort were the writers of the act, led by stalwarts, former State Geologist Jim Williams, the late Professor Ken Thompson of Missouri State University and Dr. Greg Hempen retired Corps of Engineers, to name only a few. Many others participated greatly, especially when it came to negotiating with other interested parties and successfully selling the bill to the legislators and governor. The biggest selling point was to prevent practice of geology in regard to health safety and welfare, by those not qualified. Many harmful cases of practice of geology by non-geologists or half-baked-geologists were presented to the legislators in a convincing fashion.

The Geologist Registration Act (GRA) sets forth the minimum qualifications for someone to practice geology in Missouri. Minimum hours required

to receive a license is 30 hours of geology courses, a BS degree, 3 years of experience, and completion of a certain test. These basic requirements have not changed over the years and generally seem to be adequate. The GRA appears to be doing its job and seems to be worthwhile as evidenced by the low number of practice complaints the Board receives these days.

During the past two legislative sessions, bills have been introduced that would essentially change the GRA to allow persons to practice geology who may not have even the minimum qualifications established by the GRA. The Missouri Board of Registered Geologists as an official matter does not have an opinion of these bills, and likely no member of the Board would be authorized to testify before the legislature in this regard, because the Board practices at the pleasure of the Governor of Missouri.

Aforementioned bills of this nature would influence somehow the practice of geology in Missouri, but it is not the role of the Board to support or contest this or any other bills before the legislature. Geologists organized in private groups such as the American Institute of Professional Geologists and the Association of Engineering and Environmental



CHALLENGES TO THE GEOLOGIST REGISTRATION ACT

Geologists may be the best suited to opine on such legislative actions. After all, no person could provide superior information to the legislature than professional geologists which also happen to be regulated by the State of Missouri.

So you, the regulated community of professional geologists and not the Missouri Board of Registered Geologists are the ones, if you so choose, to immerse yourself in the legislative process when it comes to the practice of geology in Missouri. Only you can provide the correct guidance to the legislature when it comes to geology matters. It is my observation that leaders of the private geologic organizations take such bulls by the horn and rightly so.

**MISSOURI LAW THAT CAN
AFFECT YOUR LICENSE STATUS****INCOME TAX & TAX RETURNS**

This law has been on the books for several years now, but a reminder is always a benefit. The Missouri Board of Geologist Registration is required to give your Social Security Number to the Department of Revenue (DOR) before granting a new license or a renewal. If you are an existing licensee, your SSN will be provided to the DOR approximately 30 days before your renewal. The DOR will determine if you owe any back Missouri income taxes or if you've failed to file a Missouri income tax return in the past three years. If so, you will be notified. You will have 90 days from that notification to rectify the non compliance or your license will be suspended until you are in compliance. If you are applying for a new license, your SSN will be given to the DOR within 30 days of your application. If you are not in compliance, your application will not be considered until you are in compliance. The current requirements became effective with the passage of House Bill 978 (2004). You may recall that House Bill 600, passed in 2003, required revocation for non-compliance. The law was changed in 2004 to require suspension. The law section is 324.010 RSMo.

Rule 20 CSR 2145-1.040 Fees contains the new fees for placing a license on Inactive Status and the Reactivation fee.

Rule 20 CSR 2145-2.020 Education Requirements contains more detailed wording related to the required thirty (30) semester hours.

Rule 20 CSR 2145-2.030 Post-Baccalaureate Experience in Geology contains more detailed description of what is required.

Rule 20 CSR 2145-2.065 Temporary Courtesy License is a new rule for temporary licenses specifically for spouse of an active duty member of the military.

Rule 20 CSR 2145-2.080 Renewal of License contains the Inactive language.
