



This is a simplified checklist of what you need to submit with an application. An incomplete application will delay processing. In order to obtain a Missouri APRN license, you must hold an active Missouri RN license or a multistate RN license from another compact state.

Apply Online:

- If you do not have an account at <https://mopro.mo.gov/license/s/>, click on REGISTER and create an account.
- If you do have an account, log in and click APPLY FOR A LICENSE.
- Be prepared to indicate AND provide the document/s that will authenticate your lawful presence. This can be a US passport (not Passport card), birth certificate or REAL ID. If a foreign citizen, see <https://pr.mo.gov/nursing-licensure-rn-citizen.asp>.
- Be prepared to list and provide your certification(s) information.
- If your first name is different than your lawful presence documentation, be prepared to upload legal documentation supporting the name change.
- Be prepared to provide your nursing program name, location, advanced practice role and population, and graduation date.
- Be prepared to list other nursing licenses you may have held or applied for.
- Answer general and criminal history screening questions and upload supporting documentation, if applicable.
- Submit payment of the required application fee via credit card or electronic check drawn in US funds. All fees are non-refundable and non-transferable.

After you have submitted your application

- Follow this process for your fingerprint background check – see <https://pr.mo.gov/nursing-fingerprints.asp>.
- Request an official final transcript, which must show your degree awarded and the completion/graduation date. The transcript will not be accepted from you. It must be sent by the primary source. If you are a new graduate, do not request the transcript until you have graduated. Electronic transcripts can be sent directly from Parchment, Credentials Solutions, eSCRIP-SAFE or National Student Clearinghouse to nursing@pr.mo.gov.
- If you are foreign-educated, you must submit:
 - Course-by-course evaluation report received directly from a foreign credentials evaluation service approved by the Board – see <https://pr.mo.gov/boards/nursing/ForeignCredentialsEvaluationServices.pdf>;
 - Evidence of English-language proficiency – see <https://pr.mo.gov/boards/nursing/EnglishProficiency.pdf>; and,
 - Copy of U.S. social security card.

If you are already licensed in another US state or territory:

Go to www.nursys.com and click on “Request Verification” to request verification of your other state nursing licenses to Missouri.

If you answer yes to a screening question(s), the documents upload page will prompt you to provide additional documents such as court documents, reference letters, etc.

All applications expire one year from the date the application is submitted. Failure to provide all required information and/or documents will result in your application expiring and will require you to submit a new application with all newly submitted documents and a new fee.
